THANK YOU, TAMBELLUP COMMUNITY CROPPING GROUP!

The Tambellup Community Cropping Group (TCCG) has since inception, contributed financially to many community groups and projects, and in December 2023, approached the Councill with two proposals which will have long term community benefits.

For many years the value (and non-availability) of a community bus has been discussed in many forums. The TCCG was aware of this, and late in 2023 resolved to place an order for a twelve-seater bus to be equipped with wheelchair access and a luggage trailer, proposing that it be used as a community bus. The TCCG has requested that the Council consider undertaking the management of this service. At the December Ordinary Council meeting the Council agreed to this proposal, and while delivery of the bus is a way off yet, staff will work on the processes and policies required to ensure the service operates efficiently and effectively.

In a second, most generous proposal, the TCCG has offered to purchase and donate two cabins to be installed at the new Tambellup Caravan Park. The TCCG presented several cabin designs for those attending the December harvest day to view and vote on. The preferred design is a one bedroom, self-contained cabin that will suit both visitors to the community and people looking for accommodation in Tambellup for seasonal work requirements.

While the Shire continues to work with consultants on the design requirements for the Caravan Park (sewer, water, power, electrical, civil services) which includes a sewer extension off Crowden St, the TCCG will liaise with the supplier to place an order for two cabins, at a cost of \$276,000. The aim is that all civil works will be complete by the time the cabins are ready for delivery and installation.

On behalf of our community — thankyou to all involved with the Tambellup Community Cropping Group for your generosity and community spirit!

FROM THE DECEMBER 2023 COUNCIL MEETING

- Specifications for repairs to the Tambellup Hall and Lesser Hall roof were endorsed.
- The Council adopted the Local Heritage Survey Primary Report, including the Local Heritage Survey and Local Heritage List, subject to amendments as recommended. Thank you to those people who contributed their feedback to this important process.
- The draft Local Planning Policy No. 3 Heritage Places was adopted for the purposes of public consultation. The policy is available to view at the Shire offices, or on the Shire website www.shirebt.wa.gov.au. Submissions are invited and can be emailed to mail@shirebt.wa.gov.au, or mailed to 46-48 Norrish St, Tambellup WA 6320 by 29 February 2024.
- The Council endorsed the terms of a negotiation between the CEO and Martinus to deposit excess fill from the CBH rapid rail outloading construction project into the old gravel pit west of the Broomehill Recreational Complex. Payment of any funds from either Martinus or CBH for the receipt of fill will be deposited into the Shire's 'Broomehill Recreational Complex Reserve Fund' for future projects.
- A plan for improvements to streetscaping to Crowden St, from Norrish St to East Terrace, was endorsed. The plan includes realigning and widening the section between Taylor St and East Terrace and planting street trees in the centre of Crowden St to create a visual link from the town centre to the sports ground.
- A planning application for a storage shed at the Tambellup Works Depot was approved with conditions.
- A review of the Shire's Housing and Land Strategy was endorsed. The review identified over 30 strategies for treatment of land owned by the Shire in toe Broomehill and Tambellup townsites.
- The Council considered and endorsed recommendations from the CEO Selection Panel in relation to the appointment of a new CEO.

RAILWAY PRECINCT TOWNSCAPE PLAN CONSULTATION

The consultation period for the Draft Railway Precinct Townscape Concept Plans ended on 31 January 2024. While the amount of feedback was not as great as we anticipated, the comments and suggestions that we received were valuable and will be considered by the Council at an upcoming Council meeting. Outcomes of this consultation will be factored in to the next stage of the design process and updated plans will be available to the community.

TRAILS PLANNING GRANT

During 2023 the Shire was fortunate to receive funding from the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries to assist with the development of a trails masterplan. The masterplan will provide the Shire with an inventory of existing and planned trails (incorporating mapping, detail of trail surfaces, drainage, directional markers, signage) and a future maintenance implementation plan.

The Shire has appointed Mike Maher (Transplan Pty Ltd) and Mike Halliburton (Halliburton and Associates) to complete this work. The two Mikes are well experienced in trails planning, having assisted many local governments across Australia and overseas to develop trails. To date, two site visits have been conducted with all existing trails assessed and documented. We look forward to receiving the final report and recommendations.

From 15 March 2024 to 15 April 2024, the Restricted Burning Period is in effect and permits to burn are required to be obtained from your brigade Fire Control officer.

Are you interested in undertaking a native planting project on your farm?

Over the past couple of years Greening Australia has received a growing number of enquiries from landholders in the Broomehill-Tambellup area seeking support to undertake native plantings with mixed trees and shrubs on their farms.

With this in mind, we are reaching out to the wider community seeking expressions of interest for our 2025 planting program.

Conversations we are having locally suggest some key reasons driving interest in native plantings and how projects can support your land and farming operation include;

- Creating habitat for native wildlife such as black cockatoos
- Tackling salinity
- Biodiverse native forage systems to support livestock
- Diversifying on-farm income by way of carbon credits



So, if you are finding yourself feeling sick, what should you do?

WA's free RAT program has now concluded. RAT kits are available for purchase from supermarkets, pharmacies, and other selected suppliers. They are no longer available at the health Centre. There is no longer a requirement for the Western Australian community to register positive RAT results.

If your RAT result is positive <u>stay at home</u> for at least 5 days and until symptoms have resolved. Seek medical advice if symptoms become severe.
