Julie will be responsible for a number of Shire facilities in Broomehill.

We are also really excited to celebrate a momentous occasion with our own John 'Yarney' Farmer. During April, Yarney clocks up his 40th anniversary with the Shire – a testament to his work ethic, commitment and ability to connect with everyone, from members of the public to Councillors and Shire staff. Yarney had been working in the shearing sheds when he was first employed by the Shire of Tambellup in 1984, so joining the Shire works crew provided a complete change, the opportunity to learn many new skills and be part of implementing many projects undertaken in the Shire. Yarney continues to be our unofficial 'PR' person in the field, and we're pleased to be able to celebrate this milestone with him. Congratulations Yarney!



FROM THE MARCH 2024 COUNCIL MEETING

The Council considered a variety of matters at the March Council meeting. The following provides an overview of the decisions from that meeting:

- A response to matters raised at the February 2023 meeting Public Question Time was provided for information to the community.
- The minutes of the Local Emergency Management Committee meeting held on 13th February 2024 were received.
- The minor review of the Local Emergency Management Arrangements was endorsed.
- Following the close of the public consultation period at the end of February 2024, Local Planning Policy No. 3 – Heritage Places was adopted. No submissions were received in relation to the draft policy.
- The Council considered a proposal by GHD on behalf of Enel Green Power Australia, to amend the Shire of Broomehill Town Planning Scheme No. 1 (TPS 1) and Shire of Tambellup Town Planning Scheme No. 2. (TPS 2). The purpose of the proposed amendment is to introduce a Special Control Area (SCA) on various lots in the vicinity of the Flat Rocks Wind Farm. Some lots are owned by participating stakeholders whose land is subject to the existing wind farm approval. Some lots are nearby to the Flat Rocks wind farm development.
- The SCAs are proposed to be superimposed onto the existing scheme maps. Specific SCA provisions are proposed to be introduced into the TPS 1 and TPS 2 text, and a new land use definition for 'agriculture-extensive' is proposed to be introduced into TPS 1.
- Advice in this regard was sought prior to the meeting, and in consideration of the advice received, the Council determined to refuse the proposal. Affected and nearby landowners have been sent a letter regarding the outcome. The minutes of the Council meeting and the scheme amendment documents are provided on the Shire website www.shirebt.wa.gov.au/council-meetings.
- An application from CBH relating to an extension of working hours at the CBH rail outloading facility, which is currently under construction in Broomehill, was approved. The extension approves night works to be undertaken until 10.00pm Monday to Saturday.
- The Council considered the feedback received in relation to the Railway Precinct Townscape Upgrade concept plans. It was noted that most of the issues raised through public comment can be addressed during the next stage of the design process, which will include specific stakeholder consultation. Staff will now liaise with the architects to develop the next stage of the plans and cost estimates and will proceed with the construction of new public toilets within the railway precinct.

- The Council supported a proposal from the Gillamii Centre in Cranbrook, for a financial contribution of \$20,000 per year for three years that will assist the Shire to achieve some key deliverables of the Strategic Community Plan around the Gordon River, Boot Rock Reserve and Tambellup Water Reserve.
- The Council adopted the mid-year Budget Review. Details of the amendments made to the budget are available in the minutes of the meeting.
- The Council supported a proposal for the Shire to purchase two cabins for the Tambellup Caravan Park to allow the Tambellup Community Cropping Group (TCCG) an opportunity to potentially purchase a property to secure the future of the cropping program. Staff will seek quotes through the WALGA Equotes system for this purpose. The TCCG have committed to purchasing a minimum of two cabins in the 2026/2027 financial year.
- A late item seeking approval to purchase a new utility for use by the Shire Ranger was considered and approved.

The Annual Electors Meeting was also held on 21st March 2024, following the close of the Ordinary Council Meeting. The Annual Report 2022-2023 was adopted and is available at the Administration Offices or online at www.shirebt.wa.gov.au/documents/council-publications. Unfortunately, no electors were present at the meeting.

The minutes from every Council meeting are available for perusal on the Shire's website www.shirebt.wa.gov.au/council-meetings and at the Shire Administration Offices and Tambellup Community Resource Centre.

The next Ordinary Council Meeting will be held on Thursday 18 April 2024 commencing at 4.30pm, in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

A CUPPA AND A COOKUP WITH THE COUNCIL!

Thank you to all those who turned out for breakfast with the Council on Friday 15 March 2024. Twenty two interested residents attended to listen to presentations from Grace Jones (Tambellup CRC) and Neil Letter (Tambellup Community Cropping Group) about what is going on with their respective organisations. We thank Grace and Neil for their time.

The informal Q&A session resulted in lively discussion around a range of matters, including the acoustics in the Pavilion, vandalism around the Pavilion, the status of the police presence in Tambellup, the progress of the Broomehill Hotel project by the Broomehill Village Cooperative, actions that can be taken about derelict houses, a request for an off-lead dog park, lighting to the Tambellup oval driveways, the adequacy of road funding, repairs to Great Southern Highway, better promotion of the Gordon River area, a request for a bulky items waste collection, and a request for trees along Great Southern highway to be removed.

As can be seen, while some of the matters discussed are in the Shire's remit and can be addressed subject to budget and/or other resourcing, the responsibility for other matters lies with external agencies and individuals. The Shire will advocate to the relative agency for consideration of these issues and will keep you updated on completing actions within our remit in future issues of Topics, and on Facebook as we progress.

We look forward to hosting the next Council engagement event in Broomehill later in the year.

COMMUNITY SCORECARD SURVEY

Residents may remember, during October and November 2023, the Shire invited participation in a Community Perceptions survey which was conducted with our neighbouring Shires, to rate a range of Shire services. At the Ordinary Council Meeting in March, the Council heard from market research organisation Catalyse, who coordinated the survey, to present the results.

Seventy one people completed the survey in the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup, with a reasonable spread across the demographics of the community. Generally, the responses indicated the Shire is performing well, in relation to the Shires that participated in this survey, in comparison to the industry averages, and in relation to the last iteration of this survey conducted in 2021.

Areas that we can be proud of include the provision of sporting facilities and services, and library services. Areas that the Shire needs to prioritise included no surprises as each has previously been identified – roads, housing, and economic development/job creation.

Sections of the survey invited participants to provide written feedback and suggestions. This information has now been received, and the Council, with staff,

will work through this list to identify areas where we are currently working, areas that need to be prioritised, and areas where the Shire will need to advocate for external assistance. IT'S STILL BUSHFIRE SEASON

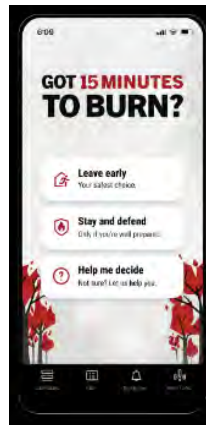

If it means that you and your household are safe during an emergency, it might be the best 15 minutes you've ever spent!

Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage 1.



Project Update – March 2024.

Commissioning Activities

Over the past two months, the Flat Rocks Wind Farm Stage 1 (FRWF1) project has completed the installation of the last Wind Turbine Generator (WTG) and successfully conducted the second round of grid compliance tests together with Australian Energy Market Operator and Western Power. The Noise Monitoring Campaign is due to start in late April (date to be finalised in the coming weeks) for a minimum period of 6 weeks, in order to capture representative data in different environmental conditions and different wind speed and directions, in accordance with the approved NIMMP (Noise Impact Monitoring Management Plan). SCA proposal lodged

Earlier this year, Enel Green Power lodged a proposed introduction of a Special Control Area (SCA) around the Flat Rocks Wind Farm (Stages 1 and 2).

SCAs form part of the Local Planning Schemes and guide the use and development of land in designated areas. SCAs are an overlay that sit above the underlying Rural or Farming Zone of the Local Planning Scheme. The proposed SCA would act as a mechanism to enable the Shires to assess whether a development proximate to the

wind farm is compatible. Through a planning assessment process, it would aim to minimise amenity impacts, especially noise, on new sensitive land uses by promoting engagement and information sharing between the wind farm operators and landholders/applicants of sensitive land uses. The proposed SCA boundary is based on noise modelling that was assessed as part of the Flat Rocks Wind Farm development approvals. The predominant use of the land within the proposed SCA area is broad acre farming or cropping. There would be no impact to these activities under the proposed SCA. Other development within the proposed SCA boundary would require relevant development approvals.



SCAs are introduced via an amendment to the Local Planning Schemes. Amendments follow a statutory approval process governed by the Planning and Development Act 2005 (Planning

Act) and its subsidiary Regulations. This process includes an extensive public advertising period, governed by the legislation.

Enel Green Power recommends interested stakeholders provide relevant feedback via submission during the formal public advertising period; this will be undertaken in accordance with the Planning Act and Regulations.

Enel Green Power will provide updates on the status of the SCA via our website, including key milestones such as dates for the public advertising period.

Nbn is undertaking upgrade work on its Fixed Wireless towers across the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup as part of the Regional Upgrade Program. The Regional Upgrade Program will benefit local households and businesses by providing access to faster speeds and extending the coverage of the **nbn** Fixed Wireless Network.

The upgrade works are part of a \$750 million investment, made up of \$480 million from the Australian Government and an additional \$270 million from **NBN Co**. Once complete, the program aims to expand the reach of the existing Fixed Wireless footprint by up to 50%, and enable many existing fixed wireless users to achieve faster and more consistent speeds during busy periods. It will enable new higher-speed tiers to be introduced, one of which when launched is expected to be available across the entire fixed-wireless footprint and deliver a peak wholesale downlink speed range of 100-130 Mbps and the other when launched is expected to be available to 85% of the Fixed Wireless footprint and to deliver a peak wholesale download speed range of 200-325 Mbps. The additional capacity and reach available on the upgraded network will also support approximately 120,000 existing Sky Muster Satellite-only premises to access **nbn** Fixed Wireless for the first time.

To enable the upgrades, there will be planned outages or service interruptions from April until Q3 this year. We will take all reasonable efforts to minimise service interruptions; however, there are occasions where towers will need to be taken offline.

Impacted homes and businesses will be notified of these outages via their retail service provider.

The tower works will not impact **nbn** Sky Muster satellite services.
