

WHATS BEEN HAPPENING OVER DECEMBER AND JANUARY?

The works crew was fully occupied just prior to Christmas carrying out urgent repairs to roads in the south east section of the Shire, following in excess of 150mm of rain in the area over a three hour period. The deluge caused flooding in some areas, with significant damage to roads and culverts. There's always a positive to come out of a negative, and in this case it is the lakes in the area that have filled, notably Anderson Lake which has seen some boating, water skiing and jet skiing action for the first time in many years.

Many of the works crew took the opportunity to take annual leave over the Christmas break, leaving the 'skeleton' crew in charge. A major project over this period was pruning roadside vegetation on Tambellup West Rd, in preparation for road widening this year.

Residents may have noticed sand being carted in to the site of the new Seniors Units - this is an exciting stage, after so long in the making. As previously advised, Council has endorsed the designs for the facility, and the project managers are now finalising tender and contract documents ready to advertise the project for tender. It is anticipated this process will be completed by the end of March, and construction will commence by the end of June.

Prior to the Christmas break, the Broomehill Administration office and library was relocated to the Broomehill Hall, to enable the office renovation works to commence. Siegrid is now working from the Hall, and all existing services are available. The renovations are expected to take up to six months to complete, and will result in a bright new library and reception area, and storage for Council records. Siegrid is looking forward to that time!

Our volunteer fire brigades were kept busy over the holiday period, with a number of fires occurring between Christmas and New Year, and again following the stormy weather mid January. Many thanks to those who attended each call out.

DISPOSAL OF WIRE FENCING AT THE REFUSE SITES

Council has always taken old wire farm fencing at its tip sites and both sites have an area where old wire fencing can be placed. This is a recyclable product however if the fencing is rolled up with wooden posts in it, it will not be taken by the recycling companies and then has to be put into landfill.

Old fencing is bulky, difficult to compact and fills up our trenches very quickly which necessitates the digging of more trenches which comes at a cost. Every trench dug reduces the life of our refuse sites. If you have old wire fencing that is to be delivered to the Broomehill or Tambellup refuse sites it would be appreciated if the wooden posts are removed before delivery.

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents are advised the **PROHIBITED** burning period commenced on **1 NOVEMBER 2012** and continues through until **14 FEBRUARY 2013** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited. To report a fire, please phone **000**.



Farmsafe WA Alliance- January 2013

FREE Emergency Care and Injury Management Workshops in the Great Southern

During February and April 2013 communities in the Great Southern region will be hosting a series of FREE workshops on the topic of Emergency Care and Injury Management.

Farmsafe WA, the organising body behind these workshops, is an independent, not-for-profit, non-government organisation which encourages and leads the way to safer farming by promoting positive farm safety practices.

The workshops, which have been funded by the Department of Health, are open for all rural community members to attend and will be presented in partnership with Fire and Emergency Services Authority of WA (FESA), WA Regional Police and St John Ambulance. Without the valuable support provided by these partners, the workshops would not be possible.

Conducted as a set of interactive skill stations each led by the different emergency services, workshop participants will acquire knowledge and skills in topics such as practical first aid, responding to and managing an emergency situation, being prepared for an emergency and the role these key organisations play in the community.

The host communities for the workshops will be Esperance (19th February, 2-5pm), Ravensthorpe (21th February, 1-4pm) and Newdegate (23rd February, 10am-1pm) with further workshops to be conducted in Mt Barker (11th April, 9am-12pm),Kojonup(11th April, 3pm-6pm) and Wagin(12th April, 10am-1pm).

Refreshments will be provided and all participants will receive a free show bag including safety information and resources. Additionally, the first 30 people to register and attend the workshops at each location will receive a free Snake Bite Kit, compliments of Farmsafe WA and St John Ambulance.

Farmsafe WA Alliance encourages people from all age ranges and walks of life to attend this community event—at no cost it is a great opportunity to learn new skills and meet your local emergency service representatives. Registrations are now open, and with limited places available please remember to register soon!





Thank you for Sophie's Fund From the Aylmores: An Update



As promised, we would like to give you an update on what has been happening with the funds that were so generously raised for "Sophie's Fund" by you, our wonderful community.

Some of the funds were used for tests to be sent to overseas laboratories. The results from these tests have helped us and other people enormously. We have discovered that Sophie has Lyme disease and other associated co-infections. The original blood tests that we had done at Red Labs in Belgium discovered Soph had Q-Fever but that was just the tip of the iceberg. When it was suggested to us that we had Soph further tested to see if she had Lymes disease we actually thought this was not going to be the case as at that point all the things we had read indicated that Lymes wasn't in Australia. When she was alive my Mum always said that she felt a miracle would happen for us to find out what was wrong with our Soph. Well, we truly believe that "Sophie's Fund" provided that miracle. We most likely would not have had further tests sent overseas if it hadn't been for the funds provided by you and we would not have discovered what we now know.

Unfortunately because Sophie went undiagnosed and untreated for nearly 10 years she has developed what is known as Late Stage Lymes Disease or Chronic Lyme Disease. There is very little known about late stage lymes disease and the best treatment for it in Australia. This leads me to the next thing that has helped us through the funds raised by "Sophie's Fund". Last year Dr Hugh Derham went on a research trip paid for by the fund. He visited the CFS/ME clinic in Belgium and also went on to visit a Lymes Clinic in Germany and came back with some knowledge on treatment that has been helpful to Soph and other patients Australia wide.

Late stage Lymes has been discovered to be the underlying cause of CFS with quite a number of people in WA. 'Sophie's Fund' further helped Soph by providing funds for us to purchase her a special bed. Soph spends most of her time in bed so this has made a huge difference to her quality of life and will be very helpful for her rehabilitation.

As you can see 'Sophie's Fund' has helped us and others more then we could ever have imagined. It is so hard to find the words to express our appreciation so our family would just like to say a huge thank you to all. We are very grateful for the continuous support and kindness shown to us and we wish you all a healthy, happy and prosperous 2013.



CONTRACTOR REQUIRED!

We are seeking a contract team who will be available to conduct weed control works during the autumn/spring period over the next couple of years. We have funding to undertake golden wattle control for a period of time, and are seeking a team to do the job. The work will require chemical application, some manual work (usually chainsaw/lopper etc), some sites may require removing the debris to a designated location which will require a truck. 

WOULD UP TO \$200 PER CHILD HELP PAY FOR THEIR SPORTING CLUB FEES?

KidSport will assist $\underline{eligible}$ families to receive up to \$200 annually for each of their children aged between 5 – 18 years, to subsidise fees to join a sport and recreation club.

Eligible families include those with health care cards or pension concession cards, or those referred by other community groups such as schools, juvenile justice teams, government agencies and health practitioners. These groups are known as referral agents.

The process for accessing KidSport is simple!

Kids and parents/guardians can complete the application by picking one up from the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup office or their website. The parent/guardian fills in the application and takes it to be validated at the <u>local government they reside in</u>. A photocopy of the health care card or pension concession card must be attached.

Alternatively, referral agents may assist in filling out the application, complete their section on the back and give it to the parent/guardian to sign. The parent/guardian will take the voucher to the sport or recreation club for processing when registering their children. The club will then invoice the Shire. It's that easy! - To find out who the Referral Agents are in your community please contact the Shire.





Social Enterprise: the next big thing?

AN EXCITING NEW FUNDING OPPORTUNITY

Social enterprise can provide a valuable source of income for not for profit organisations, helping them to meet their core objectives without relying entirely on fundraising.

The aim of the \$10million Social Enterprise Fund (SEF) is to stimulate greater interest within the sector in setting up and running social enterprises. The SEF will help existing social enterprises to grow and expand or enable new social enterprises to be established.

These social enterprises can be directly focused on achieving a social mission (for example job creation for long-term unemployed people) or they can be set up to create a new long-term revenue stream to help to make organisations become more sustainable. This new funding opportunity is a key component of the wider series of reforms for the not for profit sector, driven by the Partnership Forum.

FIND OUT MORE ...

A number of information sessions are taking place in the coming months to help you find out more about the SEF and social enterprise more generally. The session will cover:

- 1. Understanding and running successful social enterprises It will provide you with a solid understanding of what a social enterprise is, the different kinds of social enterprises, the process for establishing a social enterprise and help you make the decision as to whether this is the right option for your organisation.
- 2. How to apply for support and investment under SEF - The session will outline what support is available to social enterprises entering the program, the eligibility criteria, what investment is available and the application process for the SEF Grants Program

A DIFFERENT TYPE OF FUND

The Government has recognised that setting up and developing a social enterprise requires both investment and support. The SEF provides community sector not for profit organisations with a significant investment opportunity as well as the chance to benefit from significant support in shaping and developing their business ideas.

This support will be provided through a consortium managed by Social Ventures Australia (SVA) that includes WACOSS, Social Traders and Centre of Social Impact (CSI). The consortium will help organisations through the application process, as well as provide valuable business support and advice to those who are funded.
