### **GRATUITY AND REDUNDANCY PAYMENTS**

In keeping with the requirements of the *Local Government Act 1995* Council wishes to advise all residents of the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup that the following policy relating to Gratuity and Redundancy Payments was adopted by the Council at its meeting held on 13 October 2008.

#### **Purpose**

To describe the circumstances in which gratuity and redundancy payments may be made to staff.

### **Policy**

#### 1. Gratuities

Council will consider the payment of a gratuity to any employee of ten years or more standing who is leaving the service of the Shire either for retirement purposes or as a voluntary redundancy.

In considering this matter, Council will give particular regard to:

- (a) the employee's history and length of employment with the Shire
- (b) the employee's sick leave record,
- (c) performance review reports from the previous three years; and
- (d) the employee's personal contribution to the progress of the Shire's objectives and community wellbeing.

Council, after taking into account the above criteria, may agree to the awarding of the following gratuity:

- (a) A payment to the employee of four weeks' pay for every year of service to a maximum of one year's salary, or
- (b) A payment based on unused sick leave entitlements.

Employees leaving to take up another position elsewhere will not be eligible for a gratuity payment but may, at the discretion of the CEO, be eligible for a gift up to the value of \$100 for every year of service.

### 2. Voluntary Redundancies

In the event of council seeking applications for voluntary redundancy fro specific staff or classes of staff, council will have regard to the following, when determining a redundancy package:

- (a) the employee's history and length of employment with the Shire
- (b) the employee's sick leave record,
- (c) performance review reports from the previous three years; and  $% \left( x\right) =\left( x\right) +\left( x\right) +$
- (d) the employee's personal contribution to the progress of the Shire's objectives and community wellbeing.

Council, after taking into account the above criteria, may agree to the awarding of the following redundancy payment, in addition to award or agreement conditions:

An over-award payment to the employee of up to four weeks' pay for every year of service to a maximum of one year's salary,

## Strategic Waste Management Plan Stirling Group of Local Governments

Council invites public comment on the Shire of Broomehill - Tambellup Draft Strategic Waste

Management Plan.

The plan has been developed in alignment with the Waste Authority of Western Australia's Zero Waste Plan Development Scheme. The purpose of the plan is to provide strategies and actions to guide the Shire of Broomehill - Tambellup and other local governments in the Stirling Group of Local Governments to improve waste management practices that are

consistent with the state's vision of "Towards Zero Waste".

Relevant to the Shire of Broomehill - Tambellup is recommendations on waste minimisation, community education and consultation and the management of the current landfill sites in Tambellup and Broomehill. The plan proposes that the Tambellup and Broomehill landfills be closed and replaced with transfer stations which would be staffed and opened for set times.

The plan also recommends that discussions be held with the Shire of Katanning to ascertain the possibility and feasibility of the Katanning landfill site being developed as a regional site.

### FROM THE MEETING

### Draft Strategic Waste Management Plan

In November 2007, the Shires of Broomehill, Tambellup, Kent, Gnowangerup and Jerramungup agreed to work together to develop a Strategic Waste Management Plan for the region. The draft plan outlines existing waste services provided by participating councils, details of current waste generation including recycling data, and recommended strategies to achieve improved outcomes for the region and the individual local governments in the management of waste. A copy of the draft plan is available at the Shire Offices in Broomehill and Tambellup for inspection, and comments from members of the public are invited. Comments should be directed to the Chief Executive Officer, Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup, 46—48 Norrish St Tambellup 6320, by 14th November 2008.

### <u>Draft Policy Manual</u>

Council adopted the new policy manual for the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup. Council policies provide direction for Councillors and staff to respond to issues and act in accordance with Councils general direction. The Policy manual is reviewed by Council every three years.

### **COUNCIL WORKS**

With the recent spate of winter-like weather, works staff have attended to a number of after-hours call outs involving mainly trees across roads, and in one case, water.

A couple of major roads projects are in the early stages, with overburden from clearing on Pootenup Rd being removed, and gravel being carted in for the resheeting of the next section prior to sealing.

Preparations have also started for the widening of Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd, with extensions to culverts in this section to be completed in the near future. Maintenance grading has continued on the following roads: Crosby Rd, North West Rd, Johnston Rd, Birt Rd, Sorrento Rd, Paul Valley Rd, Brown Rd, Watergarrup Rd, Chillicup Rd, Brassey Rd, Nardlah Rd, Moulyerup Rd, Norrish Rd, Pindellup Rd, Bignell Rd, McGuire Rd.

The maintenance crew has been working across the shire carrying out maintenance to signs where required, and replacing guide posts and reflectors. Bitumen patching has been carried out on Tie Line Rd, Tambellup West Rd, Flat Rocks Rd, Johnston Rd floodway, Watergarrup Rd and Pallinup Rd.

### **DIPROSE PARK**

We have just received advice that our submission to the Community Facilities Grants Program for almost \$22,000 has been successful. These funds will allow for two shelters, tables and seating to be purchased and installed at Diprose Park. These items will be

ordered and installed as soon as the funds are

available. This will also allow the BBQ to be

reinstalled in its new location at the northern tip of the park. In the meantime, the next project is the

installation of the fencing and the outdoor gym equipment. We will be seeking assistance from the community with these tasks, so watch this space!

## DOG OWNERS – HAVE YOU REGISTERED YOUR DOG???

All dog registrations are due for renewal at

<u>31<sup>st</sup> October</u> each year. If you own a dog then your dog MUST be registered and MUST be contained on your property. If you are in a public place your dog MUST be on a leash unless it is in a designated dog exercise area.

Under the Dog Act 1976 if you look after someone else's dog, you are responsible for its actions. Dogs found wandering that are not wearing a registration tag and your name and address will be impounded and fines will be charged.

### **MOSQUITOES**

Mosquito numbers within our Shire are always an issue. Council baits pools of water and undertakes regular fogging of the Tambellup townsite in an effort to reduce the mosquito numbers.

It is proposed to commence fogging in the Broomehill townsite during the week commencing 10 November. Fogging is only undertaken when weather conditions are suitable, ie calm evenings. If you have any queries regarding this process, please contact the Shire on 98253555.

Rainwater tanks can become breeding sites for mosquitoes that can cause severe nuisance and carry serious diseases. The Department of Health have advised that the most common mosquito found to breed in rainwater tanks is a proven carrier of Ross River virus. To prevent mosquito breeding, guttering and piping should be self draining or fitted with drainage points. Water should not be allowed to pool under the overflow outlet or tap as these can become mosquito breeding sites. The tank should be a sealed unit to prevent mosquitoes entering. The inlet and overflow should incorporate a mesh cover to prevent access by the mosquito.

To stop mosquitoes breeding add a teaspoon of food grade paraffin oil (in small tanks up to 1,000 litres) to the water. (The amount needed will vary depending upon the surface area of the water. A sufficient quantity to produce a thin film over the water surface is all that is required.)

### PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Shire are reminded that the PROHIBITED burning period commences on 1 NOVEMBER 2008 and continues through until 14 FEBRUARY 2009 inclusive.

## Marie Burges

Marie Agnes McEncroe was born on 11th January 1919 in Perth where she grew up and later completed an Arts Degree from the University of Western Australia. With the advent of World War II, she embarked on a nursing career which later brought her to Katanning. as the Matron of Katanning Hospital, together with Dr Doug Pope, she established the first Maternity Ward. Following her marriage to Bert Burges in February 1954, Marie became an enterprising farmer's wife and mother to three at "Burlands" in West Broomehill. She loved the land and its flora and birdlife. Her keen interest in farming matters continued after even Bert's death in 1978 (and the lease and eventual sale of the farm)

You may not have known Marie personally, but you would have recognized her in the stylish hats (and gloves) she wore to church and town – often her own creations, as were the clothes

worn by the family. Marie was committed to her faith and church as well as other involvements over the years. She enjoyed people as well as reading extensively and listening to her favourite ABC National programs. Her funeral service was conducted in St Patrick's Church, Katanning.



## Landholder Opportunities - Carbon Capture

The Forest Products Commission – Synergy partnership was launched at the Forest Products Commission property in West Arthur in October. This partnership which will see the FPC grow trees to offset the carbon produced by Synergy in the production of electricity. Planting will start next year and the FPC is currently looking for landholders who wish to be involved.

Their 2009 targets are for plantings of 1400H in the greater Albany region and 1000H in the Katanning area. Both block and belt plantings are planned with a number of species being used.

## Katanning Runaway Bus 2008

## School Holiday Fun

The Great Southern Development Commission will again be funding the Katanning Runaway Bus in January 2009. The service to Middleton Beach from Katanning via the Great Southern Highway provides teenagers with the opportunity to go to the beach, or spend time in Albany, particularly if their families are not able to go away on a holiday.

The service will run on Tuesdays 6, 13, 20, 27 and Thursdays 8, 15, 22, 29 January 2009 for the very reasonable price of \$5 per trip. The coach will collect participants from Wagin, Woodanilling, Katanning, Broomehill, Tambellup, Cranbrook, Kendenup and Mt Barker at designated times.

The coach has four drop off points, the cinema, town centre, indoor pool at the Albany Leisure and Aquatic Centre (15 yrs under \$3.30, 16 over \$4.20, an extra \$3 for the use of the pool slide) and Middleton Beach. The coach then collects participants at an arranged time to be taken to an alternative location if desired. For example, participants may want to go to the beach in the morning then to town in the afternoon.

The coach is capable of seating 46 teenagers and boogie-boards or skate boards. The odd bicycle may even be accommodated.

### **Broomehill Historical Notes**

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Knight – Church of England Minister, from Katanning. On 21<sup>st</sup> February 1907 the new Minister called at Sunnyside: he had taken Mr Caton's place as Mr Caton had gone to Beverley. Mr Knight called at Sunnyside twice in July, August and September 1907. On two occasions he was on his way to Birt's (west of Tambellup) for the Church service the next day (Pindellup Church?). On 22<sup>nd</sup> July, TN gave him the Eticup Church accounts, £6.6.6 for Church funds, and his resignation from the Church Committee. On 2<sup>nd</sup> September, Dr Parrish was with him and TN went with them to see old Mr Nelson at Nat's place.

Knight, William Grylls – One-time Mayor of Albany. Married Ann Augusta McKail and his son Henry married Louis Van Zuilecom's daughter Caroline. Visited Goblup with Lady Campbell and also went to Fairfield. In December 1883, TN wanted Green the painter to go with him top see Mr Knight about the painting at Sunnyside badly done, but he refused to go; another painter was organized to re-do the work. In Albany on one occasion in 1884, Lady Campbell complained to TN about the condition in which he had left Goblup, and said she would take the matter to her lawyers if TN did not meet her at Mr Knight's. Quite unfazed, TN suggested the next day and Mr Knight decided in his favour, saying Goblup was in good order after five years wear.

**Koch, Alfred** – Married Edith Maud Bishop on 12<sup>th</sup> May 1905 and left (departure place unknown) for Broome Hill the next day, where he built the first town bakehouse. It was a tiny galvanized structure, and several older Broomehill residents thought that it was in Jasper St but cannot pinpoint the location.

Overington's were the first proprietors of the Bakery in the Jones' Building in 1911 and an Overington descendent has an old invoice headed Overington & Koch, with Koch crossed out. This ties in with the knowledge that Overington had a bakery in Jasper St before moving to India St, and also with the possible date of Alfred Koch's death

On 19<sup>th</sup> February 1907, TN drove to Broome Hill with 30lbs (13.62kg) of peaches for Mr "Cotch".

The Koch children were Doreen, Alfred, and Minna. Alf Koch died from Typhoid fever when his wife was carrying Minna, supposedly in Broome Hill, but there is no record of his having been buried here or Katanning.

**Krakouer** – Family of Theodore Krakouer and Brina Israel. The sons who lived in Kojonup in the 1880s were all known to settlers of Eticup.

**Krakouer, Abraham** – Eldest son who had a store in Kojonup. Called at Goblup on 2<sup>nd</sup> September 1881 and not mentioned again until 19<sup>th</sup> January 1889 when he and Mrs Newstead called at Sunnyside on their way to catch the train to Albany.

**Krakouer, David** – In partnership with Rudolph in the store at Eticup and then in Broome Hill and a member of John Holland's team cutting the track to the Goldfields in 1893.

**Krakouer, Phillip** (believed to Chub)- On 2<sup>nd</sup> February 1886, Chub Krakouer brought the mail from Kojonup. By 1890 he was living in Broome Hill with his brothers Rudolph and David and on 23<sup>rd</sup> December 1890 he accompanied TN on his inspection of the fencing done at Goblup, apparently working for Rudolph. If he was left in charge of the Store when Rudolph and David joined John Holland's team and there was, in fact, a fire, then his partnership with David after the expedition carrying goods from Albany to the Goldfields suggests the store had been abandoned.

## Can you help???

Hi my name is Ernie Polis and I am currently researching a project which will result in a publication in the very near future.

The project is related to German and Italian prisoners of war who were captured in North Africa during World War Two. Many of these POWs were sent to Australia in 1941-1943 to be kept under guard in up to 18 POW camps through out Australia.

One of these camps was No 16 POW Camp at Marrinup, near Dwellingup it was operational from July 1943 until August 1946 when the Camp was closed and the POWs were repatriated back to their homelands. The 300 German POWs were always kept at Marrinup; however the Italians were allowed to work on farms in the rural regions of WA. Up to a maximum of 3 POWs were allowed to a farmer to help him run the property and they were hired out at a rate of one pound, later two pounds per week.

Most of the 3,500 Italian POWs in WA were allowed to work on farms and they were administered by the Army which set up a HQ in various rural towns. This was allowed under the "Employment of Italian POWs without Guards Scheme" modelled on the operations in Vic, NSW, SA and Tas. The Army occupied vacant premises in various towns and they were called Prisoner of War Control Centres. There were 28 PWCCs throughout WA and one was located at Tambellup, I have very little information on the Tambellup site which was officially known as PWCC No 5. The other closest PWCCs were Nos W4 at Kojonup and W6 at Wagin.

The most northerly PWCC was at Three Springs, the most easterly was at Newdegate, the most southerly was Tambellup and the closest to Perth was at Toodyay. The first was at Bridgetown and the last at Northcliffe. These PWCCs were an important part of rural production during WW2 and many ex POWs returned to WA after the war to settle in the districts in which they were formerly employed.

From my research so far it commenced operations on 11 March 1944 and ceased operations on 30 May 1946 when all 150 Italian POWs employed in the Tambellup district were sent to the Northam Army Camp for repatriation back to Italy in September 1946. The first Commanding Officer of PWCC No 5 was Lt Huffer until 23 July 1944 when he was replaced by Lt HV Mountain who was CO until 14 November 1944; he was replaced by Lt WO Gribble who commanded until 1 September 1945. Capt L Morrish then took over until the PWCC closed, also attached were other Army personnel such as WO 2, 2IC in the opening stages and Cpl DJ Couani the Army interpreter.

I know very little else about the Tambellup PWCC and what I would like to know is where was the PWCC located, what sort of building was it, is it still there, does any one have photos of it taken during WW2, are there any residents of the Tambellup district that recall these events, remember the Army staff, remember any of the POWs and importantly have any photos of anything related to the POW episode of Australian war time history in the Tambellup district.


## **LUNGE WITH ARMS OVERHEAD**






