The inaugural Council election for the Shire will be conducted on the 18th October. The election will be conducted by the WA Electoral Commission, who, by the time this goes to print, will have forwarded postal voting forms and information to all residents and occupiers who are listed on the Electoral Roll.

COUNCIL WORKS

The roadworks program for 2008-2009 has continued this month with clearing works progressing on Pootenup Rd in preparation for the resheeting and sealing works which are to be carried out later in the year. Initial clearing work has also commenced on Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd where the seal is to be widened to 7m. Please take care when travelling in these areas.

Maintenance grading has continued with the following roads receiving attention: Eureka Rd, Jam Creek Rd, Beejenup Rd, Collins Rd, Mindora Rd, Burridge Rd, Wansbrough West Rd, Aylmore Rd, Sprigg-Simpson Rd, Nazzari Rd, Cristinelli Rd, Batchelor Rd and Hodgson Rd.

PLAYGROUND UPDATES

Another successful busy bee was held recently at Diprose Park to relocate the remaining play equipment into its new area on the Henry St side. Thanks to Andrew Leonhardt, Peter Heron, Ian Cunningham, Travis Collins, Nigel Sheridan, Barry Webster and Craig Webster, and Council staff for their efforts on the day. The fencing for the park has arrived, and will be the next activity to be organized. Watch this space! The Shire (thanks to the efforts of Kellie Patterson) has been successful in obtaining funding to purchase and install an outdoor gym at Diprose Park. This equipment will be available for all community members to use, and with the addition of lighting to the area, should be well utilized though the warmer months.

We are waiting to hear the outcome of several funding applications which will enable shelters, tables and seating to be purchased and installed, and the BBQ re-installed, hopefully in time for summer.

The preliminary stages of the project to upgrade the Holland Park playground have commenced. An enthusiastic community group are fundraising for new play equipment, and we congratulate them on their initiative in this project. Watch for updates!

LOCAL LAWS OUT FOR COMMENT

At the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup's August and September council meetings eleven draft local laws were passed for public comment.

The new local laws will replace the individual local laws from the former shires, and cover such varied activities as dog control, cemeteries, fencing, waste control and health.

'Local Government has a number of statutory responsibilities and it is important that our local laws reflect both community expectations and good sense,' said Commissioner Jan Grimoldby in resolving to make the drafts available for public comment. 'There's a lot of reading and an enormous variety of things that affect us in our daily lives contained within these draft local laws. I urge the community to comment on those areas which affect them.'

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995 CEMETERIES ACT 1986 DIVIDING FENCES ACT 1961 DOG ACT 1976 HEALTH ACT 1911

AGRICULTURE AND RELATED RESOURCES PROTEC-TION ACT 1976

Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup

The Council of the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup proposes to make the following Local Laws:-

Proposed Activities on Thoroughfares and Public Places and Trading Local Law

Purpose To consolidate matters relating to activities on thoroughfares and public places allow the local government to control trading in thoroughfares.

Effect Is that some activities are prohibited, some activities are permitted only under permit in thoroughfares and public places. Also, the local law enables a local government to require house numbering and the erection of fences in certain circumstances.

Proposed Cemeteries Local Law

Purpose To provide for the orderly management of all cemeteries within the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup district in accordance with established plans and to create offences for inappropriate behaviour within the cemetery grounds.

Effect Is that all persons engaged in the administration of the cemetery, burying deceased in the cemetery, or otherwise providing services to or making use of the cemetery, are to comply with the provisions of this local law.

Proposed Dogs Local Law

Purpose To make provisions about the impounding of dogs, to control the number of dogs that can be kept on premises and the manner of keeping those dogs and to prescribe areas in which dogs are prohibited and dog exercise areas.

Effect Is to extend the controls over dogs which exist under the *Dog Act* 1076

Proposed Fencing Local Law

Purpose To provide a sufficient fence for purposes of the *Dividing Fences Act 1961* and to state the materials to be used and safety measures to be taken for some types of fencing.

Effect Is to enlarge the compliance requirements of the *Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1960* in the erection and maintenance of fencing.

Proposed Health Local Law.

Purpose To provide a statutory means to effectively control issues that have the ability to adversely impact on the health and well being of the community.

Effect Is that the legislative power will allow the abovementioned issues to be sufficiently controlled so as to provide an acceptable standard for the maintenance of public health in the community.

Proposed Local Government Property Local Law

Purpose To regulate the care, control and management of all property of the local government except thoroughfares.

Effect To control the use of local government property. Some activities are permitted only under a permit or under a determination and some activities are restricted or prohibited. Offences are created for inappropriate behaviour in or on local government property.

Proposed Pest Plants Local Law

Purpose To provide a process for requiring landowners to control and eradicate the prescribed pest plants, Caltrop and Afghan Thistle on their properties.

Effect Is to control the spread of prescribed pest plants.

Proposed Standing Orders Local Law

Purpose: The purpose of these standing orders is to provide for the orderly conduct of meetings of the council and committees, the manner of making an effective petition to the local government, and for the safe custody and use of the common seal.

Effect The effect of these standing orders is that all council and committee meetings, the manner of making a petition to the local government, and the use of the common seal, are to be governed by the standing orders unless otherwise provided in the Act or regulations.

Proposed Repeal Local Law

Purpose To repeal those local laws that no longer have relevance.

Effect Is to ensure that no irrelevant local laws are in force within the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995 WASTE AVOIDANCE AND RESOURCE RECOVERY **ACT 2007**

Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup

The Council of the Shire of Broomehill-Tambellup proposes to make the following Local Laws:-

Proposed Waste Services Local Law 2008

Purpose: To provide for the administration of waste services, the establishment, provision, use and control of receptacles for the deposit and collection of waste and related matters

Effect: To control the collection and disposal of waste for the benefit of the community and protection of the environment.

Proposed Extractive Industries Local Law 2008

Purpose: To:

- prohibit the carrying on of an extractive industry unless by authority of a licence issued by the Shire;
- to regulate the carrying on of the extractive industry in order to minimise damage to the environment, roads and other peoples health and property; and
- to provide for the restoration and reinstatement of any excavation site.

Effect: Any person wanting to carry on an extractive industry will need to be licensed and will need to comply with the provisions of this local law.

A copy of the proposed local laws may be inspected at or obtained from the Shire offices at 46-48 Norrish Street Tambellup or 30360 Great Southern Highway, Broomehill between 8.30am and 4.30pm Monday to Friday.



SHIRE OF BROOMEHILL-TAMBELLUP MERGER UPDATE – WHAT'S HAPPENING

BROOMEHILL OFFICE

There has been a misconception out in the community that the Administration Office in Broomehill is closing down – **this is not correct**. The Broomehill Administration Office is open Monday to Friday from 8.30am to 4.30pm and provides all the services that were available from the old Shire of Broomehill. Siegrid, Adelle, Zita and Louise are there to assist you with your enquiries and attend to your requests.

The Broomehill Library is also open during office hours for all residents to utilise if they wish. The Council meets in the Broomehill Chamber every second month with meetings commencing at 4.00pm. All members of the public are welcome to attend. The October meeting will be held in Tambellup.

ROAD BUILDING EQUIPMENT

Queries have been raised about where the road making equipment has gone - has it all gone to the Broomehill Depot or has it all gone to the Tambellup Depot as the machinery is not in the yards? The maintenance grading crew are currently finishing off the winter grading while the two construction crews are clearing on the Gnowangerup Tambellup Road and carting gravel on the Pootenup Road. The equipment is parked out on the job as it is very inefficient in staff time and fuel costs to bring the equipment into town each day. The previous Councils ensured that resources and practices were put in place to achieve this.

COUNCIL ELECTIONS

NOW THE FIRE SEASON IS UPON US.....

A few things to keep in mind:

Restricted and Prohibited burning period

The **RESTRICTED** burning period commenced on **19 SEPTEMBER 2008** and continues until **15 APRIL 2009** inclusive. This means you are required to obtain a **PERMIT TO BURN** from a Fire Control Officer prior to lighting any fires during this period.

The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2008** and continues through until the **14 FEBRUARY 2009** inclusive. This means the lighting of fires is **prohibited** during this period.

Permits to burn can only be issued by the designated Fire Control Officers in each brigade as listed in the Firebreak Order each year, or the Chief or Deputy Fire Control Officers. Fire Control Officers for 2008-2009 are as follows:

- The Harvest Ban SMS system is also available for use by residents. In the event of a Harvest/Movement of Vehicle ban being imposed, a text message is sent to your mobile phone to notify you. To register for the SMS system, please contact Pam at the Shire on 98253555. All residents who have previously registered will still be recorded for this fire season.
- Harvest and Movement bans will also be advertised over the radio – ABC and RadioWest – as required.

FESA membership applications were forwarded to residents recently in an effort to ensure all brigade members were registered on the FESA database.

This is a FESA requirement to ensure all volunteer brigade members are covered under their insurance in the event of injury or loss at a fire incident.

Please remember all our Fire Brigades are made up of VOLUNTEERS, who give their time to maintain the safety of our district. We urge all residents to act sensibly during the fire season, and take all precautions to avoid a dangerous fire situation.


BROOMEHILL PLAYGROUP



National Conference Thanks to the GSACC, Hidden Treasures was accepted as a case study at SEGRA (Sustainable Environment & Growth for Regional Australia), Albury NSW in August. This major national conference attracted over 300 delegates, targeting all levels of Government agencies and many regional community groups. The conference focus was Regional planning, development and sustainability. I was lucky enough to get a ticket of leave, and act as Manny Papadoulis's packhorse (maybe the other way round!!). Two strong points of interest attracting praise from some national decision makers were:

The Hidden Treasures partnership of 7 Shires and 11 communities working together to develop rural regional diversity via joint tourism promotion and development.

Rural Group Tours development project, particularly the planned Tool Kit and Tours Network.

There was little doubt in my mind after 4 days of distributing 1 1/2 boxes of Hidden Treasures booklets and lots of talking (with a bit of dancing thrown in) that our Shires and communities were seen as progressive and leading the nation in a small way in our visionary approach to rural & regional sustainability. Thanks must go to Manny who volunteered to do the presentation and to all our very special Hidden Treasures communities.

Murdoch University Project We have recently formed an exciting research and development partnership with Murdoch University. Five years ago the Great Southern Development Commission along with most of our Hidden Treasures Shires and Murdoch University put together a plan called the "Heritage Endeavours Trail Project." This plan was the catalyst for our communities to acquire Federal and State funding. As a result the Hidden Treasures partnership was formed and progressive steps continued. The HT Destination Marketing Plan was developed, the first HT Trail Booklet was produced, a HT web-site, and HT Drive Trail and signage linking 11 communities.

Hidden Treasures has been going for some years now so it seemed appropriate to approach Murdoch to see if they would come back on board to do some tourism research, evaluation and management planning. They enthusiastically agreed. Five top tourism students were given the Hidden Treasures portfolio as this semester's tourism management project. (it's pretty broad). Negotiations are underway to continue this project for the next 2-3 years, however it is dependant on the this years outcome.

Murdoch University Hidden Treasures Familiarisation Recently three of the five students recently visited the Hidden Treasures. Despite their flying visit, they wound their ways through towns, met some lively characters, took in the sites and experienced Country hospitality. They/we, sincerely apologise to communities that were missed. Unfortunately the students only had a day and a half to spare. Despite the rush the students were extremely impressed with what they saw, learnt and experienced. Their greatest highlight being the characters and their friendliness, they all want to come back. "Thank you, to everyone who made such a great effort to make it a fantastic and unforgettable experience for the students". (Their words!!!) Broomehill Historical Notes

Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the

community each month.

Kelly, James - Shepherd for TN sometime before May 1879 until March 1882.

Kelly, William – Possibly worked for George Norrish in 1881. On 30th June 1883 Wm Kelly brought TN the keys of Lady Campbell's house at Eticup (Trimmer's place – Loc 12) that Mr Nelson had given him. On 2nd August TN gave him the keys for Lady Campbell's house so that he could shift in. By November 1883, he was employed by Thomas Lott (the new lessee of Goblup), to mind 680 sheep which he shifted from Goblup to Eticup and TN paid him for shearing at Goblup in October. On 1st December 1883, "all" went to the Eticup paddock to reap the piece that Thomas Lott had bought off Kelly. It took them 3 hours and 5 minutes to reap the hay, tie and stook it. In May 1884 Kelly got two bags of straw from Sunnyside to fill a mattress and on another occasion got gun caps. On 10th January 1886, TN believed that William Kelly had been responsible for the shots in horse Herbert's flank as Herbert had been at Kelly's on 9th January. No other reference is made to the

incident but on 1st July, Kelly called at Sunnyside on his return from the Court in Kojonup. Mrs Kelly used to call at Sunnyside, sometimes with Miss Nelson and she also visited Mrs Fox.

Kemp - On 8th March 1907, Sara Norrish and Miss Kemp drove over to Broome Hill and back again. Apparently staying at Sunnyside.

Kindred, H. - Employed by TN at Goblup as a general servant.

King – On 20th August 1864, WHG agreed with King for a fortnight. He planted potatoes, cut thatching grass and helped thatch the roof of the workshop. Finished up on 5th September 1864.

King - On 23rd December 1906, a man named King stole a mare, saddle and bridle – apparently from TN. On 7th January 1907 Constable Stevens called at Sunnyside to say there had been no tidings of the man although Richard Norrish had been told that young Ireland had seen him at the races in Perth. On 21st January TN returned home from Katanning by the evening train to find the police had recovered the mare, saddle and the bridle.

King, John - Shearing for TN at Goblup in 1879 and 1880.

Knapp – Family of John and Dorcas of Albany and friends of the Wray's (Mrs Norrish was a Wray).

Knapp, Emma - came to Mrs Christen Norrish at Ettakup in 1873

following the birth the first child, George. She was Mrs Norrish's maid and mother's help and stayed for 11 years, treated as one of the family and going everywhere with them – church, picnics and visits. In March 1880 when TN and Mrs Norrish were going away for a few days, Mrs Jos Nelson came to Goblup to look after Emma and the children although Emma must have been in her early 20s by then. On 7th October 1892 she came to stay, returning to Albany on 23rd

November. She visited again in October 1893, on each occasion travelling up from Albany with one of her brothers coming to shear at Goblup.

Knapp, James and Thomas – Members of the Goblup shearing team in 1879, 1889 and 1891.

Knapp, Robert and Frank – Both shearing at Goblup in 1891. On 4th March 1892 Robert came looking for a horse and on 7th accompanied TN's son George to Chillicup for a load of jam posts while TN went out and got his horse. Both men were in the 1892 shearing team but Robert took over from Frank half-way through. Robert was in the 1893 shearing team. On 20th November 1895, Frank arrived at Goblup from the goldfields, on his way home for a spell. On 10th October 1898 Frank was at Goblup again and next day walked to Oak Farm. On 18th

October he came from Oak Farm and returned same day.



1 Tbs chopped parsley

3 rashers bacon-finely diced

1 tsp crushed garlic

1 tsp Worcestershire sauce

Melt butter. Pour over combined ingredients and mix well. Press over chicken and bake at 180 degrees for 35 minutes or until cooked and topping is golden brown

Yummy Artichoke Dip

Preheat oven to 200 degrees (moderate oven). Rub a small-medium oven dish with a cut clove of garlic.

1 cup whole egg mayonnaise


