Services at the church are usually held on the 5th Sunday of a month, so four times a year.

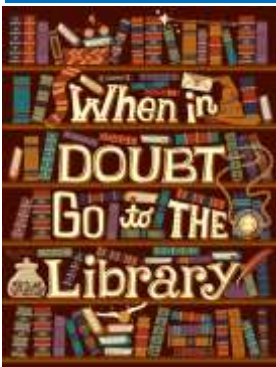

The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 21 March 2019 commencing at 4.30pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE FEBRUARY COUNCIL MEETING

Council received the Auditors report for the year ending 30 June 2018. This report provides assurance that the financial systems of the Council have been independently reviewed and are functioning reliably. No areas of concern were noted.

Council accepted the Annual Report for the year ending 30 June 2018, and determined that the Annual Electors Meeting would be held on Monday 11 March 2019 at 5.30pm.

Council endorsed the Strategic Community Plan 2018-2028. This Plan was originally adopted in December 2018, however it was noted that a number of objectives and strategies were omitted in error. The correct version of the document has been uploaded to Council's website www.shirebt.wa.gov.au/publications, and will be available at the Shire Offices and Tambellup CRC for perusal.

Council considered and approved an application for the use and development of a caretakers dwelling at Lot 403 Crosby Rd, subject to conditions.

Council granted planning consent for the use and development of a storage shed at Lot 2307 Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd, subject to conditions.

Council granted planning consent for the use and development of a storage shed at Lot 2404 Sprigg-Simpson Rd, subject to conditions.

Council considered a request to waive fees for the use of the Broomehill Caravan Park on Saturday 23 March 2019, as submitted by the organiser of the proposed Ute Muster Event. The request was granted subject to conditions.

WORKS

February was a busy month for all our works crew. The construction crew has had their collective hands full during February, finishing off the reconstruction of South Pallinup Rd ready for sealing. While half the crew was onsite here, the other half was at the Warrenup Rd reconstruction job, and both sites are now ready for the new seal to be laid in coming weeks. Blasting at the intersection of Warrenup Rd and Tambellup West Rd has been completed, and rock formations have been removed. Gravel carting to this site will now commence. The next stage in the road construction program is to prepare Morgan Road, Maguire Road and Flat Rocks Roads for sealing.

The Garrity St footpath was asphalted during February, with clean-up work to commence early in March, and asphaltting to correct the surface on Tambellup West Rd from the highway to Donald St was completed at the same time. Contractors completed the asphaltting of the apron in front of the newly extended Tambellup Fire Shed and the parking area on the west side of the building. New lines marking the laneway and no-parking areas will be applied in the near future.

The Maintenance crew has had a wide and varied task list over the past month, from grading and pot hole patching, to footpath, signage and guide post maintenance, tree pruning, and assistance with garden operations and constuction jobs. A scrap metal salvage company has been engaged to remove car bodies and metal waste from both refuse sites, and remediation works to improve the general appearance at the tips will be completed.

We have been advised the Water Corp will be carting water from a new standpipe at Crawford St, to Ongerup to supplement their ever decreasing town supply. This action is an indication of how badly rain is needed in the region, and we hope for an early break and a good wet winter.

The maintenance of watering systems at both ovals has occupied considerable time for our Parks and Gardens team. Treated water is now being used to water the Tambellup oval, and fertilising of both ovals was recently completed. Water levels at all dams have dropped, as is to be expected, and staff continue to monitor these.

A number of major upgrades have recently been completed at the Shire Works Depot, being the installation of a truck hoist, an oil dispenser system and a pallet racking system. The new equipment will assist in providing a safe work environment for all staff working in the workshop.

STAFF UPDATES



Staff farewelled Works team member Lara Hugill during February. Lara is taking some time off to spend with her baby which is due to arrive in coming weeks. We wish Lara all the best for this exciting time.

We are also pleased to advise the recently advertised mechanical apprenticeship position has been awarded to Braydon Baynes of Broomehill. Braydon will commence work at the Shire mid-March, welcome Braydon!

GREAT SOUTHERN HOUSING INITIATIVE

The Housing project is slowly gathering momentum, with the Councils involved meeting regularly to iron out the 'who, what, when and how' issues that need to be resolved before any shovels hit the dirt. The Project Control Group has determined that an independent project manager will be appointed to manage the overall project on behalf of all Shires, and the tender for this position will be advertised early in March. Work is continuing on the tender documentation for the construction of the homes, and each Council is in the process of undertaking feature and geotechnical surveys of the lots chosen for construction. We anticipate Councils will be going to tender for the design and/or construction of homes during march, with tenders being awarded in April.

CARAVAN AND RV 24 HOUR PARKING – TAMBELLUP

As residents will be aware, the construction of the Tambellup Community Pavilion and the new synthetic bowling green has left Tambellup without a caravan park. Council is aware of the gap this leaves for visitors travelling through our community, and as an interim measure, has determined to make the old Bowling Club carpark (corner Crowden and Taylor St) available for 24 hour stays for self-contained caravans and RV's. Signage will soon be installed on site and at the entrances to town to guide visitors.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

All residents are reminded that from **15 FEBRUARY 2019** until **15 APRIL 2019** the **RESTRICTED** burning period applies. During this period you are required to obtain a permit from your Brigade Fire Control Officer before lighting any fires, and all conditions on the permit must be complied with.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

During summer, a reminder about how you can keep track of Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans in the Shire:

Harvest Ban Hotline – phone 98251042. This service is maintained by the Shire and fire control officers 24/7, and provides the most reliable and up to date source of information.

Text messaging - Council offers a service to residents whereby you can receive notification of harvest bans and road closures by SMS. **If you are currently registered for this service, it would be appreciated if you could contact Marni or Pam at the Shire on 98253555 to ensure your details are correct.** Similarly, if you would like

to register, or no longer wish to receive these notifications, please contact the Shire.

Radio broadcasts – ABC radio, as the emergency broadcaster, provides updates of harvest and vehicle movement bans at scheduled times through the day. While every effort is made to ensure this information is available by broadcast times, changing weather conditions mean this is not always possible. Please do not rely on ABC or other radio stations as a single source of information.

Contact your Brigade Fire Control Officer – contact details are noted above.

And if all else fails – make a judgement call and stop work if you think conditions have deteriorated!

Are you over 50?

Have you received a Free Bowel Cancer Screening Test Kit in the mail?

2019 marks the first year in which all people between 50 and 74 will receive a National Bowel Cancer Screening test kit every two years. Cancer Council WA is encouraging everyone in the Great Southern that receives a kit, not to put it in the bottom drawer and forget about it, or even worse, put it in the bin, but to do the test and give yourself peace of mind. Less than half of all people receiving the kit in WA are participating. Cancer Council predicts that an increase in participation rates by just 20% could save over 80,000 lives between now and 2040

No need to be squeamish, as most people who have done the test say that it is far easier, quicker and cleaner than they imagined.

The kit provides every thing you need to collect the two small poo samples (grain of rice size) and return to the lab, where they look for minute traces of blood.

Blood in your poo could mean a lot of different things, but it could be an early warning sign of bowel cancer, so a positive result will need to be discussed with your doctor

Approximately 90% of bowel cancers can be cured if detected early.


CWA – Tambellup Branch

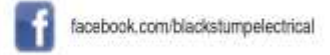
