FROM THE OCTOBER COUNCIL MEETING

Council was pleased to acknowledge a significant milestone at the October meeting. Works Supervisor John 'Yarney' Farmer has notched up 35 years of service to the Shire, commencing in 1984 as a general plant operator. John is well respected for his knowledge and personable nature, both within local government circles and the wider community, and his service to the Shire has been greatly appreciated.

Congratulations Yarney on this milestone, and we look forward to many more years of your company!

Council determined that with the Great Southern Housing Initiative project delivering new staff housing, four existing staff houses will become surplus to requirements and will be offered for sale by public treaty. Council has delegated the authority to the CEO to negotiate the sale of these properties, which will be advertised in due course.

These properties are:

- 1 Janus Street, Broomehill;
- 11 Lavarock Street, Broomehill;
- 20 Henry Street, Tambellup; and
- 27 East Terrace, Tambellup.

Council accepted the quarterly status report for the Corporate Business Plan, to the end of September 2019. This information will be available on the Shire's website in the near future.

Council granted planning consent to CBH for the development of two open bulkheads at Lot 4 Nardlah Rd, and an extension of time for storage of grain in the new open bulkheads, to June 2021.

Council granted planning consent to the proprietor of the Tambellup Deli for the installation of signage on Gnowangerup –Tambellup Rd and Tambellup West Rd, with conditions, and also granted planning consent for the development of a shed at Lot 1652 Greenhills South Rd, subject to conditions.

Council determined to advertise for public comment the application for planning consent for the use and development of Lot 572 Pallinup Rd for transient workers accommodation.

Council endorsed the appointment of Shire Ranger Damon Powell as a Fire Control officer for the 2019-2020 fire season.

WORKS

Work has commenced on the reconstruction of a 4km section of Pallinup Road. Clearing and overburden removal has been completed, and culvert extensions and replacements are now underway. Gravel carting has commenced.

Staff have been involved with the housing project, carting sand to the site of the independent living units in Broomehill for the construction of the septic. Seasonal activities are the norm for the parks and gardens crew at the moment, with mowing, weeding, spraying and mulching the order of the day.

Maintenance grading has been completed on the following roads during October: Old Broomehill-Kojonup Rd, Nookanellup Rd, North Nookanellup Rd, Sorrento Rd, Paul Valley Rd, Northwest Rd, Pootenup Rd, Pindellup Rd, Pindellup Rd, Warrenup Rd, Nymbup Rd, Bessen Rd, Moonies Hill Rd, Brown Rd, Gittens Rd.

HARVEST AND VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

As we head towards harvest and summer, a reminder about how you can keep track of Harvest and Vehicle Movement Bans in the Shire:

Harvest Ban Hotline – phone 98251042. This service is maintained by the Shire and fire control officers 24/7, and provides the most reliable and up to date source of information.

Text messaging - Council offers a service to residents whereby you can receive notification of harvest bans and road closures by SMS. If **you are currently registered for this service, it would be appreciated if you could contact Marni or Pam at the Shire on 98253555 to ensure your details are correct.** Similarly, if you would like to register, or no longer wish to receive these notifications, please contact the Shire.

Radio broadcasts – ABC radio, as the emergency broadcaster, provides updates of harvest and vehicle movement bans at scheduled times through the day. While every effort is made to ensure this information is available by broadcast times, changing weather conditions mean this is not always possible. Please do not rely on ABC or other radio stations as a single source of information.

Contact your Brigade Fire Control Officer – contact details are noted above.

And if all else fails – make a judgement call and stop work if you think conditions have deteriorated!

EMERGENCY WA

Emergency WA (www.emergency.wa.gov.au) is the State's official website for community warnings and other emergency management information for bushfires, storms, cyclones, floods and other emergency situations. The site provides real time updates on emergency warnings and incidents across the state, as well as information on preparing and recovering from an emergency situation. One to bookmark!

Well another couple of months have flown by and with that came the very sad passing of Lynthia Flowers. Lynthia held a special place in the hearts of many people in this community and from further afield. Tambellup Police wish the family all the best in moving forward.

There have been a few incidents recently that have caused people angst and are really unnecessary. The first being youths throwing rocks on peoples roofs?? This behaviour is rash, potentially dangerous and pointless. If you know anyone who has been doing this please have a quiet word in their ear or let us know who it is so that we can.

In recent times damage was caused to a house pad poured in Taylor Street and to the ablution blocks at Diprose Park and near the railway line. Sand was also thrown on the BBQ plates, which not only stops locals from enjoying the BBQ facilities, but also tourists who may want to stop and enjoy the town whilst staying here or passing through. I understand that those responsible for these senseless acts may not be reading this, however I ask that you have a chat to your kids to explain that this is wrong and that it doesn't portray the town in the right light.

I would highly recommend to anyone to have security cameras (CCTV) installed at their residence or place of work as they work brilliantly as a deterrent and in the event that an offence is committed the footage can assist us to gather evidence, something we've lacked with regard to the aforementioned incidents. The Broomehill Tambellup Shire is currently investigating the installation of CCTV throughout the shire and this is something we greatly welcome. If you would like advice on a cheap reliable system please ask Senior Constable ADAMCZYK who has the information. One resident has taken the advice and had a system installed so well done.

We all know there's burglars and thieves around the place. Just as we know there's snakes in the grass in summer. If we turn away with a hopeful, blind eye, we can be bitten. Hoping they won't come to our house doesn't remove their existence. If we trim the grass down, communicate with our fellow community members and they help look out for the snakes, we have a better chance of dealing with them. These scavenging, thieving people do exist in the community and we all must take responsibility for our properties. Board up your untenanted estates, purchase cheap CCTV and get to know your neighbours, basically take all reasonable measures to secure your properties. Then the police can do a more efficient job of locking these people away.

We recently charged a person for committing serious offences in Broomehill Village relating to burglaries. He was remanded in custody and will appear in Albany Magistrates Court at a later time.

In recent times we have detected various people driving at excessive speeds on the arterial roads in and out of Tambellup and Broomehill. Please be reminded that we are out and about and you just never know when we might come around the corner or over the hill. Surely you don't want an \$800 ticket like the one we handed out recently. Others have also been noticed not wearing their seatbelts. This WON'T be tolerated, no warnings will be issues and this carries a \$500 ticket.

Please take care of one another and enjoy this beautiful weather.

Bank opens its doors

A HUGE crowd welcomed the arrival of community banking in Cranbrook and Tambellup on Friday.

School children carrying balloons in the colours of the Bendigo Bank – maroon and yellow – added a festive touch to the occasion as shareholders celebrated the announcement that the \$285,000 needed to begin business had already been raised.

The share offer will remain open for another three months to allow as many people as

possible who have expressed an interest to invest.

The branches, which will be run by the communities in conjunction with Bendigo Bank, were the third and fourth to open in WA after the recent establishment of community banks in Kulin and Goomalling.

Bendigo Bank chairman of directors Richard Guy said there were 18 community branches across Australia and he planned to increase the number to 30 by next June.

Since the first bank of its type opened in country

Victoria 16 months ago, community banks had created 100 jobs in regional areas and generated about \$200 million worth of loans and deposits.

Mr Guy said, when he decided where to establish a new branch, the bank looked for country towns with community leaders who were passionate and energetic enough to drive the process.

"We have had nearly 1800 applications but a lot fall by the wayside because they don't...have the drive that Tambellup and Cranbrook have," he said.

"You need the kind of community that has the desire to make it happen."

The branches will employ two part-time and two full-time officers, including manager Keith McLuckie who recently moved from Perth to take up the post.

Mr McLuckie previously worked for Westpac for 16 years.

He said he looked forward to taking on the role of a traditional bank manager, which he felt no longer existed in many big city banks.

We were totally committed to this innovative approach of community ownership - a business model that would bring ongoing benefits. Brian Taylor must be mentioned at this point for his enthusiasm and mentorship was invaluable to us all.

As with many new ventures, we soon realised that opening the doors for business was the easiest part - managing this new business had its challenges and the next few years were a steeper learning curve but thanks to the diligence and perseverance of Directors and staff, and the support of Bendigo, we are here celebrating our twentieth anniversary.

To all those who have played their part over our 20 years - our many dedicated Directors, especially, Greg Mengler, Peter Jefferies, Adrian Bridge and currently Andrew Murray who have had the responsibility of being Chairman, our loyal Staff, particularly our first Bank Manager Keith McLuckie and now Steve Smith, our customers, Shareholders and Bendigo Bank support team - all the various organisations that have sought a sponsoring partnership with our Community Bank to make their particular contribution to our communities - what seemed a great idea at the time has become a reality - and a very successful one at that - congratulations to you all.

What we don't see is what is happening underneath the water

Their feelings or needs.

The behaviour is their way of getting their feelings or needs understood.

Ways to Help Your Little One Manage Their Behaviour.

Children learn by watching people around them, especially their parents or caregivers..

- ◆ Teach your child to say how they feel. If you are feeling cross or frustrated with your little one instead of yelling at them, explain that you are frustrated with their behaviour. Give the feeling a name so your child can help to understand their feelings.
- ◆ When your child is upset or angry, acknowledge how they are feeling. Eg I can see you are sad. I can see that you are angry because...
- ◆ Teach your child how to calm down when they are angry or upset by modelling. Eg: Take 10 deep breaths.
 - Count to 10 slowly
 - Try some simple yoga moves (Cosmic Yogo)
- ◆ Give your little one lots of attention when they are doing something you like—remember to tell them what you like and why and remove your attention when they are doing something you don't like.

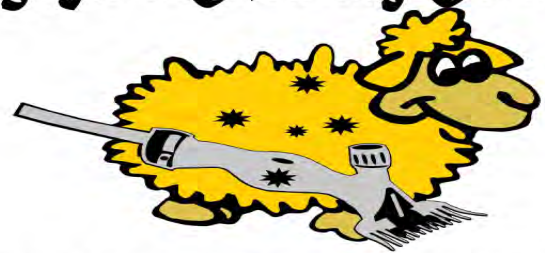

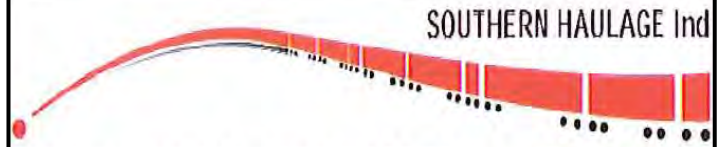
