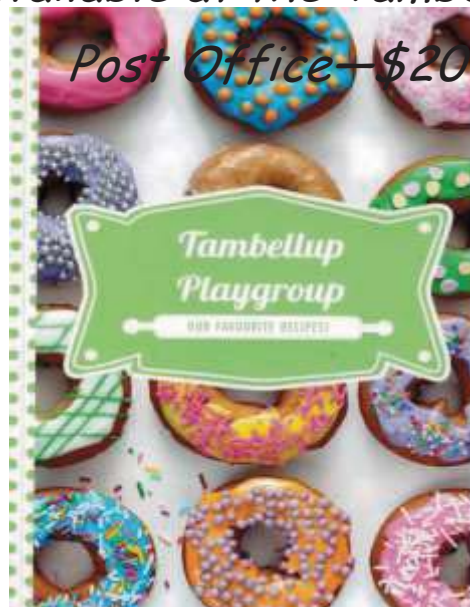

The next meeting of Council will be held on Thursday 19th July 2018 commencing at 4.00pm in the Tambellup Council Chambers. Members of the public are welcome to attend all Council meetings.

FROM THE JUNE COUNCIL MEETING

Council considered a request to close an unmade and un-named road reserve that splits a freehold land parcel east of Tambellup. Council determined to advertise the proposed closure for comment for a 35 day period.

Council discussed the budget timeline for July. A budget workshop for Councillors and staff will be held on 19 July, and a Special Meeting of Council to adopt the budget will be held on 26 July commencing at 4.00pm. Rates will be raised during the following week.

WASTE TRANSFER STATION – PRE PAID TIP CARDS

Residents are reminded that the yellow 2017/2018 Waste Transfer Station passes expire on 31 July 2018, and will not be accepted after that date. New passes valid for 2018/2019 will be distributed with rates notices for those residents who do not receive the kerbside rubbish and recycling collections, and prepaid passes will be available to purchase at the Shire Administration offices after 1 July 2018. The purpose of a Waste Transfer Station is to minimise the amount of waste going to landfill, and maximise opportunities for recycling. By sorting your load before you go to the Tip, and making sure your recyclables are clean and uncontaminated, you will be doing your bit to help our environment.

WORKS

With the end of the financial year looming, the pressure has been on to complete funded road construction projects and finalise reporting of expenditure. During May and early June, the following projects were completed:

- Warrenup Rd – construct and seal a 2.2km section;
- Tambellup West Rd – stabilise patches and reseal over a 2km section
- Broomehill-Kojonup Rd – stabilise patches and reseal
- Gnowangerup-Tambellup Rd – surface correction and reseal over a 5.6km section
- Nardlah Rd/Broomehill-Gnowangerup Rd intersection – realign and seal

Work is continuing at the Tambellup West/Warrenup Rd intersection where sight lines are being improved. The main earthworks have been completed in accordance with main Roads guidelines, however some large granite rocks require removal prior to further works being commenced.

The townscape upgrade continues on Norrish St, with material requirements determined, and drainage works will be undertaken in July.

The new washdown bay at the Tambellup Works Depot is nearing completion, with all concrete works completed to an excellent standard by Paul Plant and his team. Plumbing and electrical work is being completed at the moment and we anticipate the system being operational early in July. This is a significant project for the Shire, and it also appears to be unique within local government, according to the feedback received from other agencies. Now all we need is the rain to fill the tanks!

Maintenance works have been undertaken in a variety of areas, including pothole patching, roadside vegetation pruning on Fletcher, Graham and Chillicup Rds, removal of fallen trees from various roads across the Shire, and signage and guidepost maintenance. Maintenance grading was carried out on the following roads during June: Chillicup Rd, Brassey Rd, Greenhills Sth Rd, Collins Rd, Stirling Access Rd, Toolbrunup Rd, North Stirling Rd, Saggars St, Lovegrove St.

BROOMEHILL SHIRE OFFICE HOURS

We are pleased to advise that the Broomehill Office is once again open Monday to Friday, from 8.30am -4.30pm (closed from 12.00 – 1.00pm). Jacinta and Lesley, our Customer Service Officers, have both completed their training and as a result, all Department of Transport vehicle and drivers licensing functions are now available.

LOCAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The above committee is responsible for implementing the Shire's Emergency Management Arrangements in the event of a significant emergency incident. The Arrangements have been developed in consultation with stakeholder agencies, including WA Police, DFES, WA Country Health, Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, Department of Communities, Main Roads, Western Power and the Water Corporation. Representatives from many of these organisations, and local organisations including the Shire, St John Ambulance, our two Primary Schools, our Bushfire Brigades, the Tambellup Volunteer Fire & Emergency Service and the Broomehill Red Cross, meet quarterly to ensure the Arrangements for our Shire continue to be up to date and relevant to the risks applicable to our community.

At the fire at South Stirling last month, it was noted incident controllers had difficulty in sourcing portable sheep yards to be able to move stock from properties about to be impacted by the fire. This Shire's Emergency Arrangements note the locations of three sets of yards – on Nardlah Rd, Warrenup Rd and at the Ag Research station in Katanning. As you can imagine, the time required to transport these to an incident location anywhere in the Shire could be considerable. Ideally we would have a list of farmers willing to loan their portable yards in the event of an emergency, dotted across the Shire to enable a quick response. If you have a set of portable yards, and are willing to be included on the register, can you please contact Pam at the Shire on 9825 3555

TIDY TOWNS

Shire staff were pleased to host the Tidy Towns judges in Tambellup for the first time in many years on 26th June. With the new Depot washdown bay about to be completed, the decision was made to enter this project into this year's competition, under the Environmental Sustainability category. In conversation with the judges, it became apparent that many activities already being undertaken in both our communities support the principles of the 'Tidy Towns Sustainable Communities' awards, and that its not just about picking up rubbish.

Broomehill Museum

This month has been busy for the active members, now the museum is closed. Initially the external timber was oiled with the help of an enthusiastic painter, who we are delighted to find out is multiskilled, but more about that later.

The packing of the collection has started and probably will be the most time consuming part. Some 600 photos have been taken to update our catalogue and have a digital record. Machinery will be moved with assistance by shire staff in the next week or two. This will allow for upgrading and maintenance on the machinery shed. There has been discussion about compacted gravel for the floor as well as paths. These changes will not all happen at once. Quotes have been sought (by Neil Tears) and forwarded to the CEO, to allow for funds allocation in the next financial year.

Incidentally we are still receiving family research queries, now this has raised a question. Do we need to make the files available during renovations? If so where and to whom? The filing system needs to be sorted and updated so it is still on the waiting list of prioritised tasks.

We are going to continue these tasks on Saturdays at 2pm, please feel free to come. There is a lot of work to get through and we welcome all the assistance we can get.

I have attended a 'governance combined with a constitutional workshop' where I learnt how to comply with increasing regulations that apply to small non-profit organisations. This is seriously dull but it is important that our members know and understand that we need to comply and that means a new constitution.

The constitution will be rewritten, as ours is many years out of date, and updated by October. It is time consuming in that we will need the exe committee to meet to agree to the changes, and then sent to the members for perusal before October. Then we meet with a special meeting of all members, to pass the new form and attach the seal and forward it for verification. I am explaining this not to put you to sleep but to demonstrate we the members are all required to be involved in the process at some point - for us to remain a legitimate incorporated body.

During the pick-up last week of recyclables (rubbish) some may have noticed that we now have a collection of dilapidated wheelbarrows along the museum fence. Don't scoff there is a reason behind our madness.

Amongst our many discussions of how to focus and bring about a stronger healthier organisation, a suggestion was made to have a theme for our community. What better way can we demonstrate our connection to the Holland Track than using wheelbarrows of all shapes and sizes? Do you have any that you would like to add to those we have currently? With some work to stabilise them, we would like to plant them, probably with succulents (due to our environmental extremes) and have them all the way around our boundaries.

To be a strong healthy organisation, we need to work out how? Increasing features that may interest tourists that come through is one way, it will take time and patience. We need to raise our profile and tap into tourist dollars, wheelbarrows is just the beginning.

Terri and Angela were both pleased to visit and chat with community members about the positive experiences and support being provided through RAWA both on an individual and community basis. Both look forward to future visits!



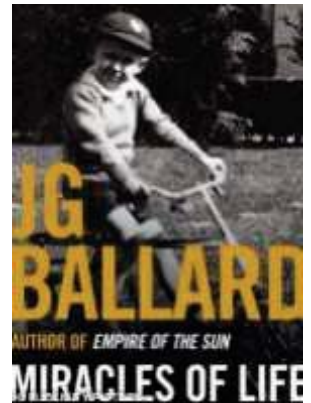
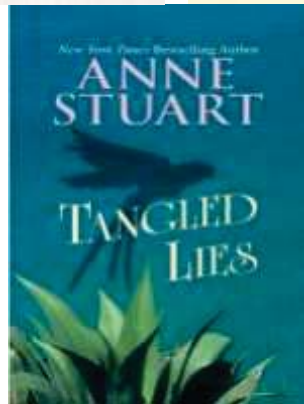
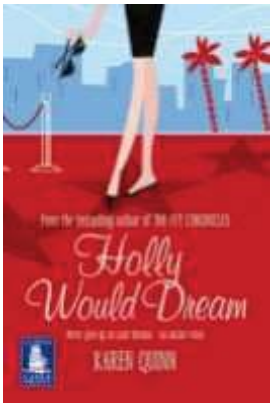
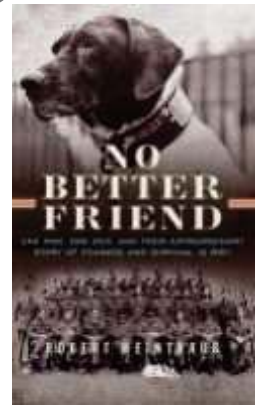
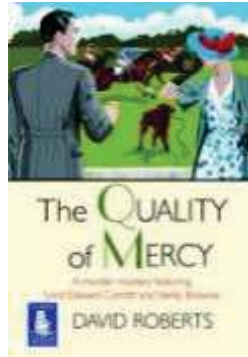
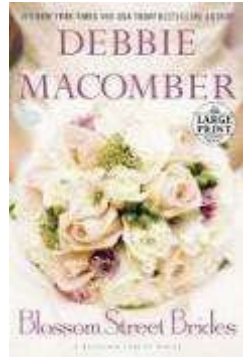
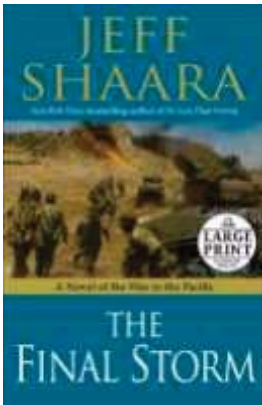
Figure 1: Jan and May



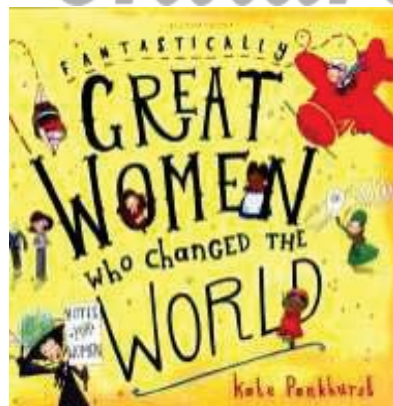
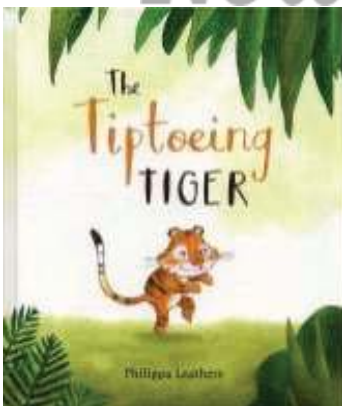
Figure 2: Angela, Keith, Lynthia, Terri, May and Pam.

Ban on lightweight plastic bags in Western Australia

Frequently Asked Questions

When does the bag ban come into effect?

The ban on lightweight plastic bags begins on **1 July 2018**.

What bags are banned?

The plastic bag ban includes all lightweight plastic bags with handles, 35 microns thick, or less (including degradable, biodegradable and compostable plastic bags).

Who does the ban apply to?

ALL retailers in Western Australia including food retailers, market stall holders and organisations that supply lightweight plastic shopping bags.

Can a retailer supply lightweight degradable, biodegradable or compostable plastic bags?

No. Degradable, biodegradable and compostable lightweight bags are included in the ban.

Degradable bags break up into smaller pieces of plastic (microplastics) and can be eaten by animals.

Biodegradable and compostable bags persist in the environment for long periods and do not break down in temperatures below 50 degrees – conditions not found in the environment for prolonged periods of time.

Does the ban apply to online sales?

Yes. The ban applies to plastic bags supplied with online purchases sourced in Western Australia.

What can I use instead of plastic bags when I go shopping?

Take reusable bags to the shops—for example hessian bags, green (non-woven polypropylene) bags, insulated cooler bags. Use a cardboard box, a paper bag, load up your pram or bike basket or put the contents of your shopping trolley straight into the car.

How can I remember to take my reusable bags to the shop with me?

- ▶ Put your reusable bags back in your car or by the door as soon as you put away your shopping.
- ▶ Write **bags** on top of your shopping list.
- ▶ Put a reminder note on the door you go out when you head to the shops.
- ▶ Put a note on your steering wheel, to remind you to grab your bags as you leave the car.
- ▶ Prepare for that unexpected shop—carry one or two foldable bags in your handbag, backpack, in your pram or bike basket.

If your smoke alarm isn't working properly, it won't warn you and your family of a fire in your home!

Is it time to change your battery?

Whether you need to change your smoke alarm battery will depend on your type of smoke alarm.

If you do need to change the battery, DFES recommends you do this on the 1st April



Smoke alarms powered by:

- 9V AKALINE BATTERY require you to replace batteries every year.
- 10-year NON-REMOVABLE LITHIUM BATTERY do not require you to change the battery each year.
- MAINS-POWERED SMOKE ALARMS have a battery back-up for periods of mains power outage. Many models have a rechargeable (non-removable) battery and do not need replacing. Refer to the manufacturer's instructions to see if you need to change the battery.

After replacing the battery

Always test that your smoke alarm is operating by holding down the test button until you hear a loud alert tone.

Things you should know...

- Not all smoke alarms need their batteries replaced.
- Smoke alarms will make a 'beep' or 'chirping' sound when they have a low battery or are faulty.
- Mains powered smoke alarms are required to have a **Green** "Power ON" LED indicator. This will light up when the alarm is connected to mains power.
- Test your smoke alarm every month by holding down the test button until you hear a loud tone.
- All smoke alarms require replacement every 10 years. If you do not know how old your smoke alarm is, it's time to replace it.

How to prepare for the storm season

⇒ Do you have an Emergency Kit?

⇒ How long would your family be able to be sustainable if the power was cut for any length of time (12 HOURS +)?

⇒ Do you have a PLAN?

Preparing your family and home for a storm is your responsibility. If you live in a storm prone area, you should make it a priority between March and May to get your home ready inside and out. There are a few simple steps that could help you minimise damage:

- Check your roof and gutters for damage or loose material
- Clear gutters and downpipes of leaves and blockages
- Trim branches near your home and hire a contractor to clear trees from powerlines
- Clear rubbish from your yard, balcony or patio and put away any loose objects
- Prepare an emergency kit with portable radio, torch, spare batteries, first aid kit and family emergency plan
- Ensure your family understand storms and the risks
- Prepare an emergency plan including a relocation plan in case your home becomes flooded. Consider what you will do with your pets and know how to turn off the gas,

DETERMINING THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL VALUE OF GROWER GROUPS IN WESTERN AUSTRALIA

An independent review and analysis of grower groups in WA to determine the economic and social value they provide to members, funders, partners and the WA economy.





GROWER GROUPS IN WA

Grower groups are central to regional and local communities in WA and play a pivotal role in the agriculture industry as a collaborative partner for both government and private companies in the extension and adoption of new technologies.

Grower groups in WA are defined as independent, self-directed, community-based groups of farmers conducting extension activities with a focus on sustainable agricultural practices and increasing farm profitability. To do this, grower groups engage funding partners, private consultants and agronomists, universities, researchers and government to ensure their members have access to relevant information to assist them to make management decisions on their farm.

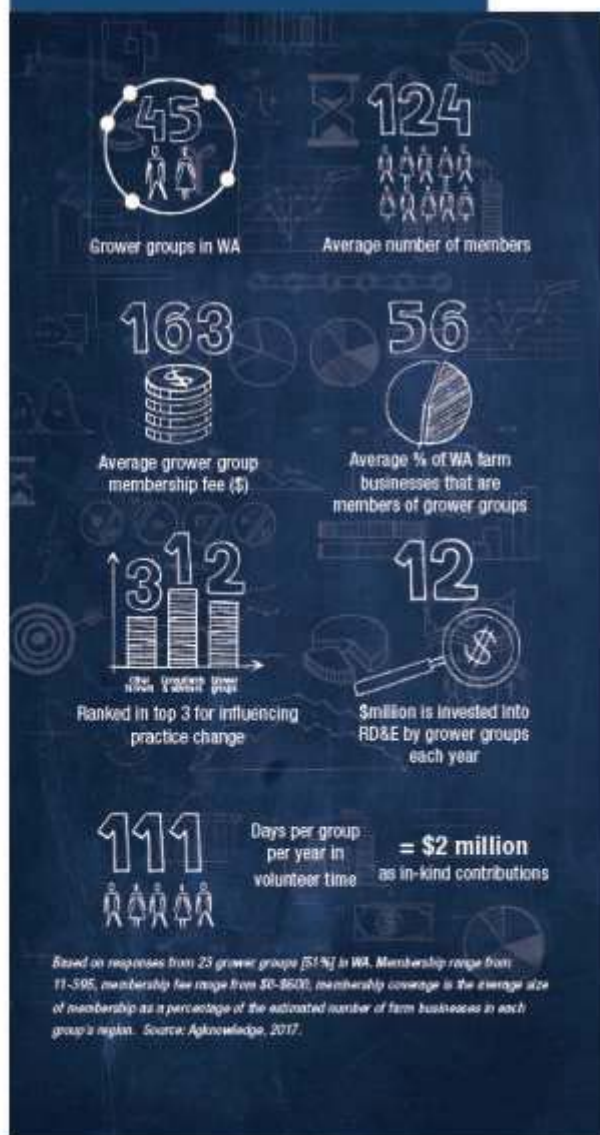
This group model continues to evolve, however the need remains for ongoing investment in the extension network to foster adoption of new technologies and practices, which is critical to improving the productivity and profitability of WA farmers. Grower groups play an essential role in this knowledge transfer and adoption process.

In 2017 the Grower Group Alliance (GGA) undertook to assess the value of grower groups in WA to determine both their economic and social

contribution to the industry, rural communities and the WA economy. Agknowledge and Advanced Choice Economics were engaged to undertake this work to determine the estimated economic and social value of grower groups in WA.

The study consisted of a desktop review, a comprehensive survey of grower groups, and a series of extensive interviews with farmers, the research and development sector, consultants, agronomists and sponsors.

ECONOMIC VALUE OF GROWER GROUPS

The research undertaken by Agknowledge has estimated that WA grower groups have generated a cumulative total economic value of \$3 billion.

Farmer and grower group surveys identified three land management practices – controlled traffic farming (CTF), deep ripping and crop/pasture variety selection – as being the top three management practices that grower groups had the greatest impact on.

For each of these practices, the percentage of area under each land management practice was determined from existing research and multiplied across the total area cropped (for CTF and deep ripping), in wheat and/or in pasture (for varietal selection) to estimate the area (ha) under each practice.¹

Farmer surveys identified the level of adoption attributed to the influence of grower groups, which was used to estimate the hypothetical level of farmer adoption in the absence of grower groups.²

This difference was multiplied by the estimated increase in gross margins from the adoption of each practice resulting in an estimated \$600 million direct economic benefits from grower groups over a 25 year period (1990-2016).³

A further \$300 million indirect benefit has also been calculated using a standard economic practice of output multipliers and includes increased expenditure in fertiliser, machinery and cartage.

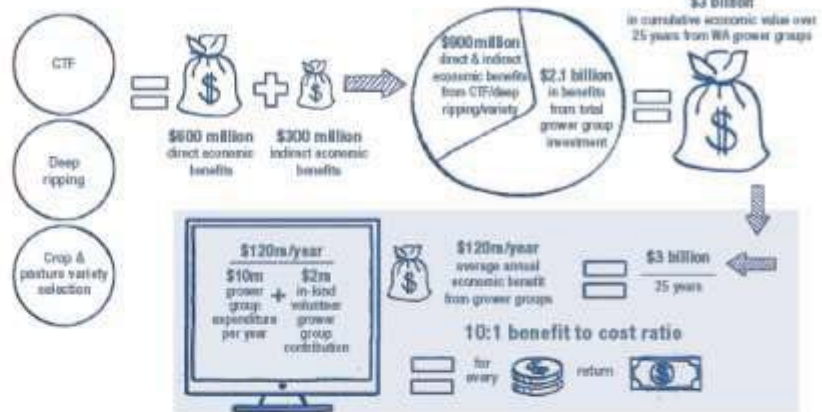


FIGURE 1: Estimating the economic value of grower groups

There is also a consumption-induced effect from increased expenditure of households due to increased incomes.⁴

Assuming that these case studies account for 30% of benefits from all grower group activities, which equals \$900m in direct and indirect economic benefits, the remaining 70% is estimated to be \$2.1b, giving a total of \$3b in cumulative total economic value. This equates to an average of \$120m/year over the 25 year period.⁵

Over the past three years the expenditure across all grower groups is estimated at \$10m/year with an additional \$2m/year as in-kind contributions.⁶ The total benefits of grower groups calculated across the 25 year period provided an average of \$120m/year. Dividing this with the \$12m/year expenditure cost of grower groups provides a benefit cost ratio of approximately 10:1.

This suggests that every dollar spent by grower groups generates a tenfold economic value to farm businesses and the WA economy.⁷

HOW GROWER GROUPS CONTRIBUTE TO WA'S AGRICULTURE INDUSTRY

Industry interviews as part of the study identified that across the agriculture industry there is strong support for grower groups in WA. It is the general consensus that grower groups fill an extension and adoption gap and are a valued local conduit between farmers and agricultural research and development.

Grower groups are valued for their role in disseminating information, organising extension and demonstration events, and facilitating opportunities for practice change which contribute to an increase in productivity and profitability.

Grower groups also provide a local and relevant network for industry to engage directly with farmers on research and development and provide an effective forum for product development.

- **Government** - groups provide a strong network of growers which enables departments to interact and focus on regional issues.
- **Research and development corporations** - groups create stronger projects by adding value to the research objectives and outcomes at a local or regional level. Groups also provide a strong and credible vehicle for extension.

- **Investment partners** - groups enable investing partners to reach more farmers and achieve effective engagement through participating in research to promote practice change.
- **Consultants** - groups validate and demonstrate research and development at a local level and act as a conduit for consultants to access information and results that are topical, relevant and applicable in developing a product or service offering.

- **Sponsors** - groups provide value through networking opportunities as well as branding and business growth.
- **Members** - groups deliver significant value to members through the sharing of resources and collaboration to deliver locally relevant research to help improve farm productivity and/or profitability.

Vaccinations don't stop at childhood.

People aged 65 years and over and Indigenous Australians are eligible for free vaccinations under the National Immunisation Program. Free vaccines include: **Zostavax (Shingles), Pneumococcal (Pneumonia) Vaccine and Influenza (Flu) Vaccine.**

What is Shingles?

Shingles is a painful blistering rash caused by reoccurrence of the varicella zoster virus. This is the same virus that causes chickenpox. Shingles can be very painful and can lead to serious, long term complications.

You can protect yourself against Shingles by having the **Zostavax Vaccine.**

The Zostavax (Shingles) vaccine is free for all adults aged 70 years to 79 years of age. It contains the live varicella-zoster (chickenpox) virus protects against Shingles. The vaccination is given as a single dose.

Pneumococcal Vaccine

The Pneumococcal Vaccine, **Pneumovax 23** is available to those people aged 65 years and older, and indigenous people aged 50 years or older. This vaccine helps protect against infection by the Pneumococcal bacteria.

The pneumococcal bacteria can cause sinusitis, otitis media or pneumonia. In adults, pneumonia is the most common illness caused by Pneumococcal infection.

Annual Influenza vaccination is the most important measure to prevent influenza and its complications. People over the age of 65 are at a higher risk of serious complications from the flu and are strongly advised to get the vaccine every year. In 2018, a new vaccine is available for people aged 65 years and over. The new vaccine has been designed to increase the immune system's response among older adults, who are known to have a weaker response to immunisation. The new vaccine includes the influenza A (H3N2) strain which has the greatest impact on people aged over 65 years.

The Influenza vaccine is free for adults aged 65 years.

All indigenous people are eligible for the Influenza vaccine.

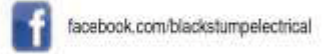
