The Year 10, 11 and 12 students studying at the Narrogin Agricultural College are currently involved in the 2013 shearing, wool handling and wool classing program.


The students are revelling in the opportunity to work in a state of the art sheep and wool training complex under the tuition of experienced instructors.

TIME FOR A RANT!

It is again disappointing to report the vandalism which has been experienced in both towns is ongoing. Recent incidents include significant damage to the disabled toilets in Tambellup, damage to standpipes in both towns, damage to gardens, the ongoing saga with the chain gate at the Broomehill Tip, upending of rubbish bins at the Tambellup Sportsground and vehicle damage to the Tambellup Oval.

Council has invested in security cameras, which are installed in various public areas in both Broomehill and Tambellup townsites. The images are of a high quality and enable perpetrators to be identified.

A recent occurrence of damage to the gardens in Diprose Park, and at the disabled toilets in Tambellup provided clear identification of those involved.

Copies of the images have been forwarded to the Police, who will be following up with parents of these children. We ask again, parents and other caregivers, do you know where your children are, who they are with, and what they are doing???

The individuals responsible for damage to the Tambellup West Rd and Broomehill Town Dam standpipes should be aware that these are also an emergency source of water which is used in case of fire. The recent damage meant both standpipes were out of action. House fires during winter are a reality, with the use of heaters and wood fires inside.

Thankfully there has not been a need recently for the fire trucks to access these water sources in an emergency; however one cannot say it will never happen. If **you** are responsible for the damage to the standpipes, we sincerely hope you never need to call the fire brigade to your house!

The camera at the Broomehill Rubbish Tip has also provided some interesting images. It is surprising to note the amount of traffic at the tip at all hours of the night. Due to the amount of waste which is deposited at the Broomehill Tip, seemingly from outside the Shire, Council is considering restricting the opening hours. The cost to manage the issue of excess waste at the tip from people living outside the Shire is borne by every ratepayer in the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire, which is not acceptable. More information on the proposal to restrict opening hours will be provided to residents in the near future.

And finally, if you are the person who cut up the Tambellup Oval, you should be ashamed. Yes, your efforts were noticed. A great deal of time, effort and money has been invested over many years to ensure our community has access to one of the best grassed surfaces in our region. Your behaviour is moronic to say the least. Again, the police have been informed.

People of Broomehill and Tambellup, we urge you to be aware of what is going on in our towns. The people involved in this senseless behaviour are affecting every one of us each time they have their 'fun'. We encourage you to report any antisocial behaviour, either to the Police, or if it involves Shire property, to either of the Shire offices.


FIRE SEASON IS UPON US AGAIN, SO HERE'S SOME IMPORTANT INFORMATION YOU NEED TO KNOW.....

HARVEST BAN ZONES

Following a request from the Broomehill-Tambellup Fire Advisory Committee, Council has established Harvest Ban Zones in the Shire, to allow for occasions where weather conditions requiring a harvest ban may not affect the entire Shire, or where assistance is required for mopping up after a fire. The Shire has been divided into two zones - the Eastern Zone and the Western Zone - with the Great Southern Highway being the dividing line. Notification of bans only affecting part of the shire will be in accordance with our established procedures - that is, broadcast over ABC radio and Radiowest, SMS to registered contacts, and recorded message on the Harvest Ban Hotline (98251042).

All residents please note: If a ban is imposed which only applies to one zone, <u>both townsites are included in</u> the ban.

Any fires resulting from vehicle movement in paddocks, open fires or hot works during periods where a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban is in force, either in a single zone or across the entire Shire, may result in court action and significant fines.



BUSHFIRE BRIGADES PROTECTIVE CLOTHING ORDERS

A flyer containing information relating to this year's protective clothing order was circulated to all residents recently. Members of volunteer fire brigades are reminded the orders should be submitted to the Shire by **Friday 20 September 2013**.

As in previous years, please carefully consider your requirements, as the amount of funding we receive from the Emergency Services Levy for this activity is limited. We would like to fill as many requests as possible.

Additionally, please be sure to refer to the sizing charts included on the flyer to ensure correct sizes are chosen. This will eliminate the need for clothing to be returned to the manufacturer for exchange.

RESTRICTED AND PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

All residents of the Broomehill-Tambellup Shire are reminded that the **RESTRICTED** burning period commences on **19 SEPTEMBER 2013** and continues until **15 APRIL 2014** inclusive. During this time you are required to obtain a permit to burn before lighting any fires.

The **PROHIBITED** burning period commences on **1 NOVEMBER 2013** and continues through until **14 FEBRUARY 2014** inclusive. The lighting of fires during this period is prohibited, however if residents need to do **PROTECTIVE BURNING** during the Prohibited Burning Period they must first obtain a permit from a Fire Control Officer and then observe all the conditions of the permit. **PROTECTIVE BURNING** is to be carried out between the hours of 6.00pm and midnight on the same day. No Protective burning is to be carried out after December 20 2013.

FIRE BREAK ORDERS

The 2013-2014 Fire Break order has been distributed with rates notices to all rate payers. If you have not received a copy, they are available at both Shire offices and the Tambellup Post Office. Please take the time to have a look and check your responsibilities as a land owner or occupier with regard to the removal of fire hazards from your property.

The Fire Brigades will be undertaking inspections of townsite properties during September to check for fire hazards. Owners of properties deemed to present an unacceptable fire risk will be requested to undertake works to remove the hazard, and additional inspections will be undertaken to ensure compliance. This activity is aimed at reducing the risk of fire, not only for you, but your neighbours and the community in general.

WORKS

Following the recent rains which resulted in the closure of gravel roads across the Shire during August, a number of complaints have been received about the condition of roads. The maintenance graders are currently working in the mid western area of the Shire. As every road in the Shire was affected, we ask for your patience as they progress.

We also appreciate the consideration shown by residents and those travelling through the Shire in not taking heavy vehicles on the gravel road network during those days following rain. We are aware the road closures inconvenienced many, however it was necessary to not only protect the road surfaces, but also road users. It should be noted that if a closure has been put in place and a heavy vehicle is involved in an accident on a gravel road during a road closure, there may be implications for the vehicle owners insurance if making a claim for damage. All residents are asked to exercise common sense following periods of heavy rain. If in doubt, please contact the Shire to check on road conditions.

Following the issuing of the works approval by the Department of Environment and Conservation, works have commenced on the construction of the Tambellup Waste Transfer station, located at the Tambellup Rubbish Tip. Sand has been stockpiled for backfilling behind the concrete walls, and the site of the transfer station has been cleared and levelled.

The construction crew has finished gravel carting on the Gnowangerup Road widening. This project will be final trimmed and sealed when weather warms for bitumen. The crew is now working on Nookanellup Rd, towards Warrenup Rd.

Roadside and town spraying will be completed in the next month, and the contractors engaged to clear debris from the roadsides from the June 2012 storm will be recommencing as soon as weather conditions allow. Council's Jetpatcher truck will also be out and about carrying out bitumen repairs across the Shire. Motorists are asked to take care when travelling in the vicinity of these works.



Council has recently received advice from the Minister of Veterans' Affairs that it has been successful in obtaining a *Saluting Their Service* Commemorations Grant to assist with the cost of restoring and preserving this significant local history for current and future generations and in respect of those who have served our country. Council looks forward to the Honour Board's restoration and re-erection in the Tambellup Town Hall and is appreciative of the Department of Veterans' Affairs for its contribution to this worthy project.

In recent weeks, I have had clubs contact me about expanding their memberships. This is fabulous news as it means we have more people wanting to be involved in organised sport! Also on this note, if there are any clubs requiring assistance with setting up committees, governance or incorporation give me a call as I am always happy to assist.

I have been approached by some members of the Broomehill community to help transform the current tennis courts to multi-purpose courts. Discussions are being held with the Broomehill Complex Committee on a proposal to add some basketball and netball lines to the current surface. This will provide an opportunity to play mixed netball in summer, training for netball and basketball.

The proposed replacement of the Kojonup netball courts is ongoing. We are currently finishing a grant application which we hope will help get this project off the ground. A recent inspection of the new multipurpose surface installed at Frederick Square, Cranbrook has provided a number or very good options for consideration. It looks fresh, bright and very modern! Exciting times for the Kojonup Netball Club, as a new surface maybe closer than you think!

ALDRIDGE WELCOMES MAJOR INVESTMENT IN FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

Regional Western Australians are set to benefit from a \$27.6million boost to emergency services after the State Government announced today that it would secure a second rescue helicopter and improve protection for the State's career and volunteer firefighters

WA Nationals Member for the Agricultural Region, Hon Martin Aldridge MLC has welcomed the State Government's decision, saying that Royalties for Regions was continuing to support vitally important regional emergency services.

"The new rescue helicopter will operate predominantly out of the South West, servicing the South West and southern part of the Agricultural Region," Mr Aldridge said.

"This helicopter will provide essential assistance to people living in the South West and Great Southern, as well as those who visit these busy tourist destinations

Mr Aldridge also welcomed the decision to provide extra protective equipment in 667 firefighting vehicles that operate in high risk bushfire area

"New fire appliances will be fitted with this technology, followed by a retrofit of existing vehicles in high risk areas," Mr Aldridge said.

"By providing more assistance to regional firefighters, we are effectively helping to protect the people who protect our lives and our livelihoods.

The protection package for tanker appliances will include

- . in-cab breathing systems providing fresh air during such incidents where air can
- under body and external water spray protection systems to wet the surrounding areas and vehicle:
- advanced Global Positioning System tracking devices which send a distress signal and allow the vehicle to be tracked live on a web-based mapping system; and critical component heat lagging and shielding to protect the fire appliance.

The funding package means that victims of serious accident or illness can expect medical help to arrive much faster and be delivered more effectively, whilst protecting our firefighters who put themselves in harm's way to protect us.

SCHOOL FEES FOR 457 VISA HOLDERS TO HIT REGIONS THE HARDEST

22 August 2013

Member for the Agricultural Region, Hon Martin Aldridge MLC has today written to the Minister for Education expressing his concerns about the State Government's decision to implement a \$4000 fee for school students living in Australia on sub-class 457 visas.

The decision seems to be a result of a 2009 Education and Health Standing Committee report that detailed deficiencies in the provision of education services to sub-class 457 Visa students, in particular English as a Second Language courses.

Mr Aldridge noted that whilst he appreciates the challenges of the State Budget, imposing this fee in the manner suggested is unfair and will create a metropolitan bias

"The concerns that I have are around fairness for all Western Australians, and this decision places a heavy and unequal burden on people in regional WA," Mr Aldridge said

"The financial capacity for a sub-class 457 family working in the agricultural sector in regional WA is vastly different to an engineer working for an oil and gas company in Perth."

Mr Aldridge continued, saving that communities with concentrations of sub-class 457 families like Gingin, Katanning, Kalannie and Dalwallinu would come under pressure as a result

"It is my concern that people who have come to Australia on a sub-class 457 visa and have decided to reside in regional areas may now have little choice but to withdraw their children from local schools and return them to their home country," Mr Aldridge said.

"This could have a devastating effect on small towns where these people have become contributing and respected members of the community."

Mr Aldridge agrees that some cost recovery may be necessary to improve the services offered to students, particularly English as a Second Language, however he has recommended some amendments to the process to improve fairness

"I hope that the worst case scenario is that the fee be means tested, leading to a situation where those unable to pay the full fee don't have that burden placed on them," Mr Aldridge

"I hope that by working with the Minister on this issue we can achieve a fair outcome for all."

Broomehill Historical Notes


Quite a few years ago Shirley MacDonald began to work through the diaries of her Grandfather, Thomas Norrish (TN) which he wrote when he first came to Eticup to take up farming and the diaries of William Henry Graham (WHG) who was also one of the first pioneers of the Eticup district. Shirley collated all the information both in alphabetical and chronological order. There are many wonderful pieces of information and anecdotes in these diaries and we are proud to share them with the community each month.

Smith, John (One Arm Jack) – In 1886 One Arm Jack had apparently been working for TN's nephew as, on 30th July, TN wrote that Jack had come to the Sheep Wash and helped with the sheep and that he had left Tambellarup. On 6th August One Arm Jack came to Sunnyside with Ben Robins (who was digging a pond in TN's Chillicup paddock) to get their picks sharpened. On 1st September Robins and Smith came in from Chillicup – they had finished the pond and TN settled with Robbins next day - £6.13.6. On 6th September Ben Robins and Jack Smith began putting up a fence over by Nelson's blacksmith shop. One Arm Jack is not mentioned again until 25th November 1892 when he came with the Martinup team to pick up Cox's box.

Smith, J – Known as "Two Rags" was at Goblup on 1st July 1881 with James Drury.

Smith, Patrick (Paddy) – On 3rd May 1881 TN referred to Paddy Swift, a shepherd, who is recorded as having worked in Albany, this entry is believed to mean Paddy Smith as on June 10th Deveral took rations to William Peters and Paddy Smith. The next few entries about him indicate that he was gathering sandalwood for TN who settled with him on 3rd September. On 11th September 1881 Paddy Smith went to Garrity's to work and on 5th December TN sent Paddy Smith and young James Deveral with two horses and cart to Peters' hut for the sandalwood roots that Smith had got in. On 7th January 1882 Paddy started for Deep Creek to sink a tank – apparently not very successfully as, on 20th, TN selected a fresh place for the tank. On 4th February he came in for dynamite as there was rock in the tank. The job was finished on 29th April and TN settled with the tank-sinkers on 10th May

sinkers on 10th May. However on 8th May Paddy started again as general servant and the next day helped Johnny gather rushes for the lambing yards. On 15th December 1882 he went with John Griffen and Johnny to cut rushes to thatch the haystack, and on 30th started for Pingelup with Griffen. During April 1883 he called at Goblup several times in the company of Henry Townsend on their way to Fairfield for seed corn and chaff. He called again on 16th July for some dynamite and on 17th August went to where he was sinking a tank near Churchill's camp (Pootenup area), but Smith was at Townsend's. The tank was not finished according to agreement. The next day TN returned to the tank with Henry Townsend and Smith to dig a drain to the tank. Smith returned to Goblup on 21st August and on 23rd carted bricks for the new house (Sunnyside). On 28th September he was put to cutting chaff and filled 8 bales, 24 bags, and on 15th October he carted timber. In January 1884, TN went to Boylup to bring in some sandalwood that Paddy had got for him. He apparently ceased working for TN about this time as the next mention of him is not until 1st August 1884 when he came looking for work, and brought an order from William Peters for rations to be sent by natives.




